# K1. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING HELD ON 15TH MARCH, 2013.

Consideration was given to minutes of the previous meeting of the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board, held on 15th March, 2013.

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Resolved:- That the minutes of the previous meeting be approved as a correct record for signature by the Chairman.

#### K1. MATTERS ARISING.

There were no matters arising to report.

#### K1. AUTHORISED REPRESENTATIVES.

It was noted that Councillor. B. Mordue was attending this meeting on behalf of Doncaster Metropolitan Borough Council representative, Councillor C. Mills.

#### K1. IAA2 REPORT.

Further to Minute No. D8 (Delegation of Powers) of the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board held on 29<sup>th</sup> June, 2012, consideration was given to the report presented by the Legal Adviser to this Board, which noted the delegations under the Second Inter-Authority Agreement (IAA2) for the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board for the Municipal Year, 2013-2014. This committee had been created pursuant to Section 101(5) of the Local Government Act, 1972.

The report outlined proposals for how the Joint Waste Board would be delegated to the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Steering Committee, which would be empowered to make day-to-day decisions relating to the Principal Contract. However, the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1972 did not allow for the delegation of powers to be exercised jointly by a committee of officers.

The proposed scheme of delegations for the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Councils' Joint Waste Project for the 2013-2014 Municipal Year were suggested. The roles would rotate to avoid a conflict of interest so that no Authority was holding more than one of the three key roles: -

- Authorised Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee member (Chairperson of that Body): -
  - Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council for the 2013-2014 Municipal Year;
- This Officer would subsequently delegate certain functions to the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager in order to deal with the day-to-day functions of the Principal Contract.

- The membership of the Steering Committee would be: -
  - Barnsley Representative: The Assistant Director, Highways, Engineering and Waste Management and Neighbourhoods. In their absence, the Group Manager, Waste Services:
  - Doncaster Representative: The Assistant Director, Environment. In their absence, the Head of Service for Environmental Protection;
  - Rotherham Representative: The Director of Streetpride. In their absence, the Waste Strategy Manager.

Resolved: - (1) With the exception of the decisions reserved to the Authorities for a unanimous decision under IAA2 all other decisions in respect of the Principal Contract are delegated by the Joint Waste Board to the Authorised Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee Member.

- (2) The Authorised Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee Member may elect to delegate certain decisions to the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager.
- (3) The Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager may delegate any decisions delegated to her to a member of the Joint Waste Team (if the right to delegate is granted by the Authorised Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee Member).
- (4) The Joint Waste Board noted that Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council's representative on the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee would be the Authorised Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Steering Committee Member for the Municipal Year, 2013/14.

## K1. BARNSLEY, DONCASTER AND ROTHERHAM MANAGER'S ANNUAL REPORT.

Consideration was given to the submitted annual report of the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager. The information contained within the report included: -

Since publication of the report an update was available in relation to section 6.3.4 'Bolton Road Construction'. The Planning Consent had been referred to the Planning Casework Unit on 16th May, 2013, due to the Green Belt issue. No call-in had taken place, so the decision had been upheld and was now subject to Judicial Review.

Since publication of the report, in relation to section 10.1 'Health and Safety' two injuries that were reportable to the Health and Safety Executive had occurred. In relation to Section 10.2 an incident of ocre water had occurred resulting from a blockage and subsequent stagnation of water. The Environment Agency had been involved and had ruled that there were no issues of concern.

Discussion ensued on the nomination of the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Project for a Partnership Award. The Project did not win this category, although feedback had suggested that it was very close and the standard of entries had been exceptionally high. The Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board Elected Members thanked the Officers involved for their hard work.

Resolved: - That the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager's annual report be received and the information noted.

#### K1. RISK REGISTER.

The Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board considered the updated Waste PFI transition phase risk register.

It was noted that the risks in relation to business continuity resulting from 'permitting delay' and 'permitting failure' had now been closed off.

There were no issues to report based on the risk status report as at 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2013.

Resolved:- That the updated information on the risk register be received.

#### **K1.** AUDIT SUMMARY REPORT.

Further to Minute No. D35 (Audit Action Plan) of the Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Joint Waste Board held on 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2013, consideration was given to the report presented by the Barnsley,

Doncaster and Rotherham Manager in relation to the strategic-level governance review of the Waste Management PFI Contract between the three Local Authorities and 3SE. A rating of adequate of assurance was given in relation to the internal control framework, meaning that a sufficient framework of key controls existed, which was likely to result in objectives being achieved, but that the control framework could also be stronger.

The Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Manager reported on the ongoing progress in relation to this rating.

There were three actions outstanding in relation to open risks: -

- Contract Manuals resources had been increased to complete production of contract manuals within the timescales available;
- Terms of Reference the terms of contract would be merged into a terms of reference specific for each group;
- Rotherham's Finance Systems were being updated and Barnsley. Doncaster and Rotherham procedures were being implemented to comply with the new systems.

Resolved: - That the progress towards the recommendations of the Waste Management PFI Contract Review Audit Report, 2013, be noted.

The financial records would be available for public inspection between 24<sup>th</sup> June, 2013 and 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2013. Notice of this would be displayed in the three Authorities between 10<sup>th</sup> June and 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2013.

#### 3.0 Technical

#### 3.1 Bolton Road

Shanks have submitted a planning application to re-profile an area of green belt adjacent to the anaerobic digestion (AD) facility. This will allow for further screening of the facility, the landscaping will include an area of biodiversity. The details are being developed in conjunction with RMBC Landscape Design and Biodiversity Officers to ensure the integrity of Brookfield Park is maintained. Shanks have also agreed to maintain the wider park area for a period of 5 years.

Shanks will be submitting some section 73 amendments to the AD plant. The Environment Agency requested that the leachate tanks for the facility should be sited above ground rather than underground. The control room for the AD Plant is to become an integral part of the facility and this will change the roof profile; the overall size of the facility will not be increased by these changes.

Jones Celtic Bio-Energy (JCBE) the AD contractor is now on site and have commenced piling. The complexities of having two Construction Design and Management (CDM) sites, is being managed by Turner and Townsend and the BDR CDMC Advisor is liaising closely with the contractors to ensure good operating practices.

The Joint Waste Team is undertaking an analysis of how to maximise the benefits of the facility.

#### 4.0 Legal

#### 5.0 Financial

The operational management costs are projected to be within budget for 2013/14.

The Joint Waste Team is currently working on systems to ensure the apportionment of costs is in line with the requirements of the Inter Authority Agreement (IAA2).

The Audit Commission have completed their audit of the BDR Annual Return year ending 31/3/2013 and the notice of conclusion of the audit will be displayed across all 3 LA's for 14 days from 30/9/2013.

#### 6.0 Communications

The Community Liaison Group paid a visit to the site on the 9/9/2013. The visit went well and all who attended were impressed by the progress that has been made.

SSE the Solid Recovered Fuel (SRF) Offtakers launched a free internet portal on 19/9/2013; the aim of the portal is to create a platform for SSE to post contract opportunities and increase visibility of its procurement process. Local businesses will be able to view and bid for opportunities in a simple process and even register to receive alerts if suitable contracts are posted.

The initiative is part of SSE's commitment to promote local procurement and source goods, works and services from small to medium enterprise organisations in the areas in which it operates.

BDR are supporting this initiative and are organising a local event in conjunction with Local Business Development and Procurement Officers across the three Councils 0n 15/10/13. Rotherham's Investment and Development Officer (RIDO), is leading on the co-ordination of this event alongside Barnsley and Doncaster Development Officer, the details of this are currently being finalised. This event will be advertised in line with RIDO's approval process, although BDR Manager and Communications Team have had sight of all information and adverts,

Birse Civils are taking part in the national Open Doors weekend as part of their Considerate Constructors scheme on 27/9/13. All schools in Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham Council areas received emails about the event from the Communications team via the appropriate School Contact Officers in their authorities. Registrations to take part in the event have been received from Barnsley College - 32 places in total and Boston Spa College - 17 places in total as well as 1 private individual. Pupils who registered an interest will get the opportunity to take a look behind the scenes of the construction site at Bolton Road.

The BDR Project has been shortlisted for the Chartered Institute Waste Management (CIWM) Excellence Award – ERM Energy Recovery.

#### 7.0 Resources

The post of Project Support Officer is currently being recruited to, this is due to the level of work necessary to develop the financial and operational systems required for commissioning and service commencement.
