1. Summary

This report concerns an application made for proposed House to House collection Promoters permits in or about the Borough of Rotherham. The application has been made in accordance with the House to House Collections Act 1939.

Where a person who is promoting, or proposes to promote, a collection in any locality for a charitable purpose makes an application to the authority for the area in the prescribed manner specifying the purpose of the collection and the locality within which the collection is to be made, and furnishes them with the prescribed information, the authority shall, subject to the provisions of the act, grant to them a licence authorising them to "promote" a collection within that locality for that purpose.

"Promoter" means, in relation to a collection, a person who causes others to act as collectors for the purposes of the collection.

The income generated will provide vital care and support to all whose lives are affected by leukaemia and allied blood disorders.

Charitable Benefit for Rotherham:

As defined by the applicants in the application or with supporting documentation: Leukaemia Care is a national charity and will be able to provide care and support for all leukaemia sufferers throughout the UK.

Should the permit(s) be granted at the hearing any permit would only run from the date the Sub-Committee approves the application until the requested expiry date unless otherwise granted by the Sub-Committee.

If the dates requested by the applicant have passed then alternatives dates can be offered for the time period requested e.g. one week / one month etc.

A copy of the original application paperwork is attached as Appendix A.

A Charity Commission search and report is also attached as Appendix B.

8. Finance

Permits for House to House collections in or about the Borough of Rotherham are provided free of charge to applicants (there is no statutory provision for charging). Any relating enforcement and other matters of application processing are financed through the authority's normal budgeting methods.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

Failure to fully consider each application could lead to inappropriate collections being made within the Borough.

When a licensing authority refuse to grant a licence (or revoke a licence) which has been granted, they shall forthwith give written notice to the applicant or holder of the licence stating upon which one or more of the grounds set out in House to House Collections Act 1939 Section 2 sub section 3 (copied below in italics) the licence has been refused (or revoked) and informing him of the right of appeal given by this section, and the applicant or holder of the licence may thereupon appeal to the Secretary of State against the refusal or revocation of the licence as the case may be and the decision of the Secretary of State shall be final. The time within which any such appeal may be brought shall be fourteen days from the date on which notice is given.

A licensing authority may refuse to grant a licence, or, where a licence has been granted, may revoke it, if it appears to the authority—

- a) that the total amount likely to be applied for charitable purposes as the result of the collection (including any amount already so applied) is inadequate in proportion to the value of the proceeds likely to be received (including any proceeds already received);
- b) that remuneration which is excessive in relation to the total amount aforesaid is likely to be, or has been, retained or received out of the proceeds of the collection by any person;

- c) that the grant of a licence would be likely to facilitate the commission of an offence under section three of the Vagrancy Act 1824, or that an offence under that section has been committed in connection with the collection:
- d) that the applicant or the holder of the licence is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence by reason of the fact that he has been convicted in the United Kingdom of any of the offences specified in the Schedule to this Act, or has been convicted in any part of His Majesty's dominions of any offence conviction for which necessarily involved a finding that he acted fraudulently or dishonestly, or of an offence of a kind the commission of which would be likely to be facilitated by the grant of a licence;
- e) that the applicant or the holder of the licence, in promoting a collection in respect of which a licence has been granted to him, has failed to exercise due diligence to secure that persons authorised by him to act as collectors for the purposes of the collection were fit and proper persons, to secure compliance on the part of persons so authorised with the provisions of regulations made under this Act, or to prevent prescribed badges or prescribed certificates of authority being obtained by persons other than persons so authorised; or
- f) that the applicant or holder of the licence has refused or neglected to furnish to the authority such information as they may have reasonably required for the purpose of informing themselves as to any of the matters specified in the foregoing paragraphs.

10. Policy and Performance Agenda Implications

The granting of House to House permits is consistent with the Corporate Plan and community strategy as it ensures the deliver under the themes of a Safer and Fairer Rotherham; also ensuring that the Council continues to maintain its statutory functions and undertakes appropriate enforcement to support the delivery of safe communities in Rotherham.

COMMERCIAL PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

(1)LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY (Registered Charity Number 259483)

and

(2) EAST LONDON TEXTILES LIMITED (Registered Company No 05373866)

AGREEMENT

DATED

BETWEEN

- 1) **LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY** whose registered office is at One Birch Court ,Blackpole East, WORCESTER WR3 8SG (the "LC"); and
- 2) **EAST LONDON TEXTILES LIMITED** (Registered Company No. 05373866) whose registered office is at 6 Cambridge Court, 210 Shepherds Bush Road, London, W6 7NJ (the "CP").

BACKGROUND

- a) The **Charity** (**LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY**) is the beneficial owner of the Name, and Logo and is licensed to exploit them, in particular, to grant sub-licenses.
- b) **CP (EAST LONDON TEXTILES LIMITED)** is a commercial participator in relation to the Charity as defined in Section 58 of the Act.
- c) This agreement is entered into to comply with the Act and the Regulations.

NOW IT IS AGREED as follows:

1. Definitions

In this agreement the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

'the Act' the Charities Act 1992 (as amended);

"Bags" the bags produced to be used for door to door collections, details of which

appear in Schedule 2;

"CP" Commercial Participator – specifically, East London Textiles Limited

"Goods" good quality clothing, paired shoes, bedding, handbags, belts, soft toys,

perfumes, cosmetics etc. given by the general public;

"H/O" Home Office.

"LC" Leukaemia Care Society - Registered Charity Number 259483 'Logo' the logo of the Charity, details of which appear in Schedule 1;

'Month' &

'Monthly' refer to a calendar month;

'Name' the Charity, LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY (Reg.No 259483)

'Regulations' the Charitable Institutions (Fundraising) Regulations 1994 (as amended);

'Fee' the fee (Clause 5 schedule of payments) being exclusive of VAT per Year for

the use of the Name and the Logo;

"Term" the Term shall be five years from the date of this agreement

'Territory' Great Britain; 'Year' calendar year;

'VAT' value added tax (where applicable) and chargeable under the Value Added Tax

Act 1994, and any similar replacement and any additional replacement tax.

2. The purpose of this agreement is to raise funds for the Charity via the Charity by the CP collecting door to door in the Territory, Goods, in Bags to bear the Charity's Name and Logo alongside the name and logo of the CP, and then the CP re-selling the items collected, and paying the Fee (as detailed in schedule 5) to the Charity each year.

3. Appointment of Sub-licensee

In consideration of the undertakings given by CP in this agreement, The Charity hereby appoints CP as its exclusive sub-licensee to use the Name and Logo on the Bags in the Territory for the duration of and on the terms of this agreement subject to clause 10.1.

4. Obligations of CP

CP undertakes with the Charity (LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY) that it shall:

4.1 not bring the Name or the Logo into disrepute in any way whatsoever and that none of its activities or those of any subsidiary or holding company are or will be inimical to the activities of the Charity(LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY);

- 4.2 promote the Bags throughout the Territory where it is able to obtain the relevant licences and where it believes in its discretion it is appropriate to do so;
- 4.3 create and manage the design artwork, print and manufacture of the Bags and all advertising material relating thereto, but on condition that it shall obtain the prior written approval of The Charity (which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed) to all materials which bear the Name and/or Logo;
- 4.4 be responsible for the production, promotion, marketing and distribution of the Bags and to that end may enter into such reasonable agreement as it shall think fit so as to fulfil its obligations under this agreement;
- 4.5 ensure that the Bags shall be of good quality and comply in all respects with all relevant statutory standards and shall have the following statement clearly visible on the outside of each Bag:
 - "This bag and its contents, once given by the householder, are the property of East London Textiles Limited (E.L.T.) who will pay the FEE (as detailed in Schedule 5 table below) per calendar year to The Charity, LEUKAEMIA CARE SOCIETY (Reg No 259483)
- 4.6 on request and at all reasonable times make available to the Charity documents, or other records which relate to the production, promotion and collection of the Bags and are kept for the purposes of this agreement;
- 4.7 pay all monies due to the Charity from the CP from time to time into a separate bank account in the CP's name and marked accordingly as requested.
- 4.8 abide at all times with Part II of the Charities Act 1992 and the Data Protection Act 1998 and, in particular, will state on all notices, advertisements and other documents soliciting funds for the Charity the fact that the Charity is a registered charity and the Charity's registered charity number;
- 4.9 use reasonable endeavours to obtain all necessary licences to carry out door to door collections in the areas selected by the CP or any other aspect of the activities carried out by the CP under this agreement.

5. The Fee

The table below shows the payment schedule for each respective year from the start date. The table also shows the payments based on (1) Collection **WITHOUT** a granted Home Office (H/O) Exemption Order and (2) **WITH** a granted Home Office (H/O) Order.

N.B. It is assumed that the Home office Exemption Order will be granted at the time of contract commencement IN WHICH CASE Payments will be made as set out in TABLE **2.1** below, however, where this is NOT the case payments will be made according to the table below 1.1 (WITHOUT H/O EXEMPTION); if thereafter the H/O Exemption is granted during this term, payments will automatically be made according to table 2.1 (WITH H/O EXEMPTION) and payed Pro-Rata for the remaining part of the respective year starting at the next calendar month in which the exemption is granted .

- 5.1 In consideration of LC granting to CP the sub-licence in clause 3, CP shall pay the Fee to LC in accordance with the rest of this clause 5;
- 5.2 CP shall within 30 days of receiving a valid VAT invoice from LC pay (as laid out in Scedule5 above, plus VAT (if applicable) to TC being the proportion of Fee attributable to the previous Month;
- 5.3 LC undertakes with CP that it will donate all taxable profits for the financial period(s) to which this agreement relates to for its stated charitable activities;
- 5.4 In the event of termination of this agreement the Fee shall be paid pro rata up to the date of termination.

5.5 Within 30 days of termination of this agreement CP shall draw up and deliver to LC a statement showing the amount of Fee(s) paid during the period from the last statement until termination, and the amount of any remaining Royalty due (if any). In the event that the statement shows that the amount of Royalty due to LC is less than the amount paid, LC shall pay to CP within 14 days of submission of the statement an amount equivalent to the difference between the amount paid and the amount due.

6. Termination

- 6.1 LC shall be entitled to terminate this agreement forthwith if:
 - (i) CP fails to pay any sum due to LC after the due date and LC has given CP 30 day's written notice requiring it to pay and CP has failed to pay in the 30 day period;
 - (i) CP does anything which in the reasonable opinion of the charity, LC or the Charity is reasonably likely to bring the Name or Logo or reputation of either LC or the Charity into disrepute;
 - (ii) A resolution is passed for the voluntary or compulsory liquidation of CP or a receiver is appointed over all or part of its business;
- 6.2 CP shall be entitled to terminate this agreement forthwith if a resolution is passed for the voluntary or compulsory liquidation of LC or the Charity or a receiver is appointed over all or part of LC's or the Charity's business;
- 6.3 LC and CP shall be entitled to terminate this agreement by giving not less than six Months prior notice to the other expiring on or after three years from the date of this agreement;
- 6.4 CP shall be entitled to terminate this agreement where it can be proven as a business case that the collection becomes non-viable and non-profitable; in this case, not less than Six Months' notice shall be given to LC and after termination LC is allowed to seek alternative CP.
- 6.5 if LC terminates this agreement under 6.1, or CP terminates this agreement under 6.2, or LC or CP terminate this agreement under 6.3, CP will no longer be authorised to use the Name and Logo, and will cease immediately the distribution and production of the Bags or other existing products bearing the Name and Logo;
- 6.6 subject to the rights of termination under 6.1, 6.2 and 6.3 this agreement shall continue.
- 6.7 Notwithstanding termination of this agreement clause(s) 8 (if termination is within 3 years of the commencement of this agreement) and 9 shall survive termination.

7. Indemnity

7.1 Subject to clause 10.4 CP agrees to indemnify TC and the Charity in respect of any costs, claims, loss or liability whatsoever suffered by TC or the Charity (including reasonable

- legal costs and disbursements paid by either) as a result of any material breach by CP of the terms of this agreement. Any liability under this indemnity will be limited to a maximum of 1 year contract value and claimed prior to the termination of this agreement.
- 7.2 Subject to clause 10.4 LC and the Charity agree to jointly indemnify CP in respect of any costs, claims, loss or liability whatsoever suffered by CP (including reasonable legal costs and disbursements) if in relation to the CP's use of the Name or the Logo the intellectual property rights of any third party are breached. Any liability under this indemnity will be limited to a maximum of 1 year contract value and claimed prior to the termination of this agreement.

8. Exclusivity

- 8.1 CP undertakes that this agreement is non-exclusive. CP has the right to enter into other agreements as they may choose bearing in mind consideration to its own financial costs and self-conflict of interest.
- 8.2 In consideration of the considerable financial investment by the CP, and the Charity undertake with CP that for three years or such longer period as this agreement exists they will not enter into a similar agreement with any other party or subsidiary in respect of the collection of Goods or in any way similar to that which this agreement refers, except in the case of a termination in accordance with clause 6.4.

9. Confidentiality

- 9.1 LC and Charity agree to treat as secret and confidential and not at any time for any reason to disclose or permit to be disclosed to any person or persons or to otherwise make use of or permit to be made use of any information relating to CP's business affairs or finances where knowledge or details of the information was received during the period of this agreement.
- 9.2 The obligations of confidence referred to in this clause shall not apply to any confidential information which:
 - 9.2.1 is in the possession of and is at the free disposal of the LC or the Charity or is published or is otherwise in the public domain prior to the receipt of such information by the Charity or the LC; or
 - 9.2.2 is or becomes publicly available on a non-confidential basis through no fault of LC or Charity; or
 - 9.2.3 is received in good faith by LC and/or Charity from a third party who on reasonable enquiry by LC or Charity claims to have no obligations of confidence to the CP in respect of it and impose no obligations of confidence upon LC or Charity; or

9.2.4 the obligations imposed by this clause on LC and the Charity shall apply mutatis mutandis to CP.

10. General

- 10.2 no amendment or addition to this agreement shall be made unless made in writing and executed by the parties;
- 10.3 the parties are not partners nor joint ventures nor is CP entitled to act as nor represent itself as agent for LC or the Charity, nor to pledge the LC's or Charity's credit;
- 10.4 neither party shall be liable for any breach of any term of this agreement that is the result of any cause beyond the reasonable control of the party in breach;
- 10.5 this agreement shall be governed by the laws of England and Wales;
- 10.6 any notice to be served on any of the parties shall be sent by pre-paid recorded delivery or registered post to the address above (or such other address as may be advised from time to time) and shall be deemed to have been received within 72 hours of posting.







8. Finance

9. Risks and Uncertainties

Failure to fully consider each application could lead to inappropriate collections being made within the Borough.

When a licensing authority refuse to grant a licence (or revoke a licence) which has been granted, they shall forthwith give written notice to the applicant or holder of the licence stating upon which one or more of the grounds set out in House to House Collections Act 1939 Section 2 sub section 3 (copied below in italics) the licence has been refused (or revoked) and informing him of the right of appeal given by this section, and the applicant or holder of the licence may thereupon appeal to the Secretary of State against the refusal or revocation of the licence as the case may be and the decision of the Secretary of State shall be final. The time within which any such appeal may be brought shall be fourteen days from the date on which notice is given.

A licensing authority may refuse to grant a licence, or, where a licence has been granted, may revoke it, if it appears to the authority—

- a) that the total amount likely to be applied for charitable purposes as the result of the collection (including any amount already so applied) is inadequate in proportion to the value of the proceeds likely to be received (including any proceeds already received);
- b) that remuneration which is excessive in relation to the total amount aforesaid is likely to be, or has been, retained or received out of the proceeds of the collection by any person:
- c) that the grant of a licence would be likely to facilitate the commission of an offence under section three of the Vagrancy Act 1824, or that an offence under that section has been committed in connection with the collection:
- d) that the applicant or the holder of the licence is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence by reason of the fact that he has been convicted in the United Kingdom of any of the offences specified in the Schedule to this Act, or has been convicted in any part of His Majesty's dominions of any offence conviction for which necessarily involved a finding that he acted fraudulently or dishonestly, or of an offence of a kind the commission of which would be likely to be facilitated by the grant of a licence;

- e) that the applicant or the holder of the licence, in promoting a collection in respect of which a licence has been granted to him, has failed to exercise due diligence to secure that persons authorised by him to act as collectors for the purposes of the collection were fit and proper persons, to secure compliance on the part of persons so authorised with the provisions of regulations made under this Act, or to prevent prescribed badges or prescribed certificates of authority being obtained by persons other than persons so authorised; or
- f) that the applicant or holder of the licence has refused or neglected to furnish to the authority such information as they may have reasonably required for the purpose of informing themselves as to any of the matters specified in the foregoing paragraphs.


