1. Purpose of Report

To consider an application to vary a premises licence made under the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the premises known as **Reresby Arms**, **Vale Road**, **Thrybergh**, **Rotherham**, **S65 4DN**.

2. The Application

The application is attached to this report at Appendix A.

The applicant is Star Pubs & Bars Limited.

The grounds for the hearing relate to the receipt of a representation received by a Responsible Authority and an interested party considered to be placed in objection to the granting of the variation for this premises.

The premises currently does benefit from a premises licence for the sale of alcohol.

3. Reasons for Referral

The representations are attached to this report at Appendix B.

In considering an application the licensing authority has to exercise discretion when representations, either positive or negative, are received from a responsible authority and interested parties.

It is for the licensing authority to decide if a representation is relevant to the licensing objectives and not frivolous or vexatious. If the licensing authority decides that a representation is relevant then the authority must hold a hearing to consider that representation.

The applicant has agreed additional conditions following consultation with Trading Standards; these are attached at Appendix C.

The applicant has been invited to attend the hearing.

The responsible authority and interested party who have made representations on the application have been invited to attend the hearing.

4. Financial Implications

There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal at the Magistrates Court or higher courts. In such a case it is not possible predict the outcome of any decision by the Courts in relation to costs.

5. The Legal Position

Section 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives namely:

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Act also requires that the Licensing Authority has regard to its own 'Statement of Licensing Policy' and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State in carrying out its functions.

Once a determination has been made by Members of the Licensing Committee, section 52(11) of the Act states that the determination does not have effect until:

- the end of the period given for appealing against the decision; or
- if the decision is appealed, until the appeal is disposed of.

6. Hearing Regulations

Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State. The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations.

7. Options available to the Licensing Committee

Please note that the Licensing plan was amended recently but that a few slight alterations are proposed, essentially to the toilets, the main front entrance and kitchen areas. The pool table area has also been replaced with dining covers and play equipment is to be erected in the external area.

It is noted that sale of alcohol is already permitted until 02:00 daily and on occasions the premises would wish to have the flexibility to provide regulated entertainment during their current operating hours.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

In light of the proposed changes, after 23:00 all external windows and doors will be kept shut whilst regulated entertainment is being provided. Doors may be open for normal entrance and egress but must be shut immediately thereafter.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed requesting customers to respect the need of local residents and to leave the area quietly.

The children's play area in the fenced area at the front of the premises will only be open until 21:00 hours during the week and 22:00 at weekends and during school holidays.

Hi Lisa,

Please be advised I have looked at the attached variation for the premises licence for the Reresby Arms public house Vale road at Thrybergh.

I do have certain concerns regarding the extension of hours for the purposes of playing recorded music and live music. They are proposing to extend the hours in the week Monday – Friday until 24:00hrs and at the weekend Friday and Saturday until 01:00hrs. This public house is surrounded by domestic premises. One would envisage noise complaints from surrounding residents if the noise from amplified music wasn't controlled within these late times, in order not to cause a noise nuisance to surrounding residents.

It is my proposal that they revise their proposed variation for the purposes of playing recorded music and live music in the midweek. Monday – Friday and Sunday until 23:00hrs and Friday and Saturday evening until the hours if 24:00hrs. in order prevent excessive noise nuisance to surrounding residents.



Following discussions with Trading Standards I would be most grateful if the variation application for the Reresby Arms could be amended to include conditions whereby

- 1. The premises will operate as a minimum a Challenge 21 policy whereby anyone that appears to be under the age of 21 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over eighteen years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a Passport, photo card Driving Licence, an EU/EEA National ID card or similar document, an HM Forces Warrant Card or a card bearing the PASS hologram.
- 2. A refusals log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months and made available upon request to Police Licensing or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority.
- 3. All staff shall be trained in relevant age restrictions in respect of products, recognising signs of drunkenness, how to refuse service and the conditions in force under this Licence. Documented records of training completed will be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and records made available for inspection upon request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority.

Mandatory Conditions

All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -
 - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the

vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision [except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos]

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
- in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
- (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- For the purposes of this section:
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Please be advised we have received 3 noise complaints regarding this pub from late night entertainment from nearby residents.

We have also received 4 complaints reading rubbish to the rear yard.

I do have certain concerns regarding the extension of hours for the purposes of playing recorded music and live music. They are proposing to extend the hours in the week Monday – Friday until 24:00hrs and at the weekend Friday and Saturday until 01:00hrs. This public house is surrounded by domestic premises. One would envisage noise complaints from surrounding residents if the noise from amplified music wasn't controlled within these late times, in order not to cause a noise nuisance to surrounding residents.

It is my proposal that they revise their proposed variation for the purposes of playing recorded music and live music in the midweek. Monday – Friday and Sunday until 23:00hrs and Friday and Saturday evening until the hours if 24:00hrs. in order prevent excessive noise nuisance to surrounding residents.






