1. Purpose of Report

To consider an application for the review of a premises licence made under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the premises known as **Today's Local, 6 Upper Mill Gate, Rotherham, S60 1PF**.

2. The Application

The applicant is Chris Burnett, Principal Licensing Officer on behalf of Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council.

The application is attached to this report at Appendix A.

The application to review relates to the four objectives under the Licensing Act 2003 namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

The grounds for review are that the Local Authority are not satisfied that the premises licence holder is promoting the four licensing objectives namely public safety, public nuisance, crime and disorder and protection of children from harm.

The response from an interested party is attached at Appendix B.

3. Reasons for Referral

The Licensing Authority must refer any application for review to the Licensing Committee if they relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.

The applicant and the premises licence holder have been invited to attend the hearing.

4. Financial Implications

There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such a case it is not possible predict the outcome of any decision by the Courts in relation to costs.

5. The Legal Position

Section 4(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives namely:

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Act also requires that the Licensing Authority has regard to its own 'Statement of Licensing Policy' and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State in carrying out its functions.

Section 52(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 requires that the Licensing Authority must, having had regard to the application for a review and any relevant representations, take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

Under section 52(4) the steps are:

- to modify the conditions of the licence;
- to exclude the licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months; and
- to revoke the licence.

Once a determination has been made by Members of the Licensing Committee, section 52(11) of the Act states that the determination does not have effect until:

- the end of the period given for appealing against the decision; or
- if the decision is appealed, until the appeal is disposed of.

6. Hearing Regulations

Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State. The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations.

7. Options available to the Licensing Committee

Members of the Licensing Committee authorise officers to:

- modify the conditions of the licence;
- exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- remove the designated premises supervisor;
- suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- revoke the licence; or
- reject the application for review.

1. Application is made for a summary review of the premises known as Today's Local, 6 Upper Mill Gate, Rotherham S60 1PF.

2. The application is based on the four licensing objectives :

The prevention of crime and disorder

Public safety

Public nuisance

Protection of children from harm

3. Today's Local is a small premise situated on the pedestrianised precinct within Rotherham town centre. The premises are licensed for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. The premises also sell other items including confectionary and foodstuffs. The licence permits the sale of alcohol daily between 0600hrs to 2300hrs.

4. Over the past 12 months there has been a steady increase in alcohol related disorder and nuisance.

5. The premises were initially visited on 19th April 2017 by Rotherham Licensing Enforcement Officer Chris Burnett following a number of complaints in relation to nuisance and under age sales.

6. The visit revealed a number of breaches of the premises licence at Annex 1 and 2 :

No premises licence summary displayed or available.

No premises licence available to inspect.

Spirits displayed on shelves rather than behind the counter.

No notices advising customers to leave quietly.

Children permitted to be in the premises without an adult.

No time parameters set out when children are permitted to be on the premises.

Off licence sales area no separated from the area where confectionary is displayed.

7. The matter was discussed at length with the premises licence holder, the DPS and also the general manager. A return visit was subsequently made to the premises and the breaches appeared to have been addressed :

A premises licence summary was on display.

The premises licence was available to inspect.

Spirits were only on display behind the counter.

Notices advising customers to leave the premises quietly were not in place.

Confectionary had been moved to a location away from where alcohol was displayed. It was noted that the rear fire exit was blocked almost in its entirety with several cases of cans of alcohol stacked up. Advice was given to ensure this remained free from obstruction.

8. Agreement was reached with the premises licence holders that a variation would follow to address conditions on the licence which would improve the general operating methods and also remove conditions which were either unhelpful or unenforceable.

9. The application to vary the licence was never made.

10. In March 2018, further issues in respect of the premises were highlighted by the Police and the Environmental Health team. The issues continued to be around disorderly conduct fuelled by alcohol being served to persons in drink and known street drinkers.

11. As a result of continued problems at the premises, on 12th June 2018 a meeting took place at Riverside House between the Local Authority, the Local Policing Team, the premises licence holder, the DPS, the general manager, and the legal adviser for the premises. A number of issues including sales of alcohol to persons in drink, the serving of strong alcohol and the action which should be taken to promote the licensing Objectives and co-operate with the Police were discussed.

12. As a result of the meeting an action plan was agreed. A number of variations to the existing premises licence were offered and these were voluntarily included within the action plan with a view to the conditions being applied by way of variation at Annex 2 of the premises licence during or following the three month action plan.

13. Following the action plan, however, incidents have continued to take place at the premises, including disorder and a clear lack of willingness to assist the Police and ensure public safety is preserved. Numerous Police requests for CCTV footage in respect of incidents at the premises have been ignored by the management and there continues to be a lack of willing to provide evidence to address crime and disorder. There is evidence of staff serving to persons in drink and CCTV footage of staff serving to customers whilst fights are taking place within the premises.

14. The premises were subsequently visited by Police and Council enforcement staff on Friday 20th July 2018. The inspection revealed continued breaches of the premises licence including a failure to implement and maintain an incident log and refusals register, staff training records unsigned and once again spirits on display on the shelves and not behind the counter. The fire exit was once again partially blocked with cases of alcohol.

15. A further visit on Monday 23rd July 2018 saw similar blockages of the fire exit with cases of alcohol. On both occasions staff were instructed to remove the obstructions immediately.

16. It has become very apparent that despite continued efforts by the Police and the Local Authority to work with the premises, and a voluntary action plan, the premises appear unwilling or unable to ensure the four licensing objectives are being properly promoted. There is a lack of direction and leadership by the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor, a lack of training for the staff, resulting in little or no understanding of licensing legislation and good practice, including the conditions currently on the licence designed to protect children from harm, and an alarming number of examples of staff serving to persons in drink, which has resulted in concerns for public safety. A number of businesses adjacent to the premises have provided Community Impact Statements to the Police setting out how the conduct of the premises is having a detrimental effect on their business.

17. For the reasons set out above, application is made under S51 Licensing Act 2003 for a Review of the Premises licence. The application is based on the four licensing Objectives and seeks a revocation of the premises licence. Additional documentary evidence and video footage will be disclosed in due course and used at the Licensing hearing in support of this application.

Re: Licensing review – Today's Express, Bridgegate, Rotherham, S60 1SN

In view of the licensing review which I understand is taking place at Today's Express, I would like to raise my concerns and respectfully request that the alcohol license relating to these premises is withdrawn, or conditions imposed upon it.

I am writing to you, in my capacity as a local business owner based in the town, a concerned employer, and also as an individual who is proud of our town, and keen to see it improve.

My business has been based at 32a High Street since January 2013. I access my office from the Rotherham Minster gardens. In recent years I have noticed a significant increase in the amount of anti-social behaviour which takes place within the grounds of Rotherham Minster. Almost all of the individuals who are responsible for this behaviour consume alcohol, which I have witnessed being purchased from Today's Express.

Over the past two-three years, I have reported this behaviour to South Yorkshire Police more times than I care to remember. Members of the local police force share my view that one of the main catalysts for this anti-social behaviour is the irresponsible way in which alcohol is sold by Today's Express.

The strong lager consumed by many of the drinkers I encounter on an almost daily basis is sold in black and gold cans. South Yorkshire Police have informed me that whilst most alcohol vendors have voluntarily withdrawn this product from sale, Today's Express continues to sell the product, which presents a clear and direct link between the alcohol sold by the business and the anti-social behaviour it has caused.

I have spoken to South Yorkshire Police extensively about the anti-social problems we encounter within the grounds of Rotherham Minster. Examples of the behaviour both I, my staff, and perhaps most concerningly of all, clients which my business is dependent upon, has included:

- Vulgar language
- Littering
- Threatening and intimidating behaviour (including fighting)
- Swearing
- Begging
- Violence
- Urinating in the grounds of the Minster

Clearly such behaviour remains entirely unacceptable. Whilst Today's Express is clearly not responsible for this behaviour, the irresponsible way in which alcohol is sold to these individuals is

clearly acting as a catalyst. Should alcohol not be readily available, then I suspect the anti-social behaviour we witness would cease.

I feel it is important to stress the behaviour I have witnessed isn't solely isolated to the grounds of Rotherham Minster, but frequently takes place near to the Heart of Steel, and the benches located directly outside of Today's Express on Bridgegate.

I employ two young females who are reliant upon public transport. As such, they must walk past the Heart of Steel and along Bridgegate to catch their buses home. One member of staff has been threatened by an individual who was clearly under the influence of alcohol consumed from Today's Express – this experience left her frightened, upset and clearly worried about her safety in Rotherham Town Centre. I feel it is totally unacceptable that anyone should feel threatened or intimidated in this way.

Whilst I accept that Today's Express is not the sole business responsible for selling alcohol in the town centre, it is the one which is located most closely to the sites mentioned above.

It is perhaps worth noting that I have witnessed first hand the shop selling alcohol to individuals who are clearly intoxicated – something which I believe breaches licensing conditions: This can be as early as 10am in the morning.

As a final point, I would like to draw your attention to the impact this behaviour has upon my business. I am proud to have based my business in Rotherham Town Centre, creating new skilled jobs and opportunities to help others forge successful careers in their chosen vocations: The increased numbers of incidents we are being forced to report and the high numbers of alcohol related incidents within the grounds of Rotherham Minster in particular, has made me question seriously whether my business has a future in Rotherham Town Centre.

Anti-social behaviour is on the rise. Drinking on the streets is on the rise. This is at a time when significant efforts are being made to regenerate Rotherham Town Centre. I feel the way in which the terms of the license granted to Today's Express are clearly being flouted, an unwillingness to work alongside South Yorkshire Police in terms of tackling anti-social behaviour, and perhaps most importantly of all the impact the alcohol sales have upon my own business, my staff, and the clients we serve, must be addressed.

Despite assurances I have received from Town Centre meetings I have attended, both the Council and South Yorkshire Police appear powerless to prevent this problem from arising. I feel if the alcohol license is removed from Today's Express, this would be a significant step forward in addressing one of the root causes of anti-social behaviour in Rotherham Town Centre.

Regrettably, I am unable to attend the hearing on 22nd December due to work commitments, however, I would also like to advise the committee that whilst it is the numbers of anti-social behaviour incidents relating to alcohol being sold by the shop in question have reduced, they have not gone away.

I have noticed that whilst the numbers of distinctive black and gold cans of strong lager have reduced, this has been replaced with alternative forms of alcohol, including different branded cans and bottles of wine/ lager.

I have continued to witness drinkers consuming alcohol on the benches outside of Today's Local, the near to the Heart of Steel Monument, Riverside Precinct and within Minster Gardens. As the shop in question is the nearest licensed premises to these locations, I feel it is reasonable to conclude that the alcohol is being purchased from the shop in question. In some cases I have witnessed these drinkers leaving the shop in question with alcohol which has clearly been sold to them.

I would like to make the committee aware that the instances of alcohol misuse has had a detrimental impact upon my business in the following ways:

- Rotherham is a very difficult place at present to run a business, which is exacerbated by anti-social behaviour. My clients don't like visiting the town centre, and my staff don't feel safe. I strongly feel the alcohol being sold by Today's Local has a direct and clear link to the levels of anti-social behaviour within Rotherham Town Centre and would urge the committee to implement an immediate revocation of Today's Local's alcohol license.
- Since the summer, members of staff have left the business because they do not feel safe walking down corporation street, passing the shop. I have expressed concerns about this previously, however, having spoken to members of staff who have left the business, it is clear this was an important factor in their decision to leave the business.

Whilst I have been working the RMBC and South Yorkshire Police to tackle these problems – sadly, this has not proved to be enough to keep them within the company.

- The street drinkers in the minster gardens has resulted in visitors to my business feeling threatened and intimidated, due to approaches for money, enabling them to purchase alcohol from Today's Local. This has resulted in the loss of at least one client
- The discarded alcohol cans and rubbish is leaving the Minster Gardens looking unsightly at times and there have also been recent instances of broken glass left from discarded bottles.
- When I have visited the store late at night, I have witnessed at first hand the shop selling alcohol to people who are clearly exhibiting signs of high levels of intoxication.

As a fellow business owner in Rotherham Town Centre, the last thing I want to see is another empty shop front, however, I strongly feel the removal of the alcohol license from Today's Local would have a positive impact upon the reduction of this anti-social behaviour and I would be grateful if the additional points I have raised could be taken into account when reviewing this case.

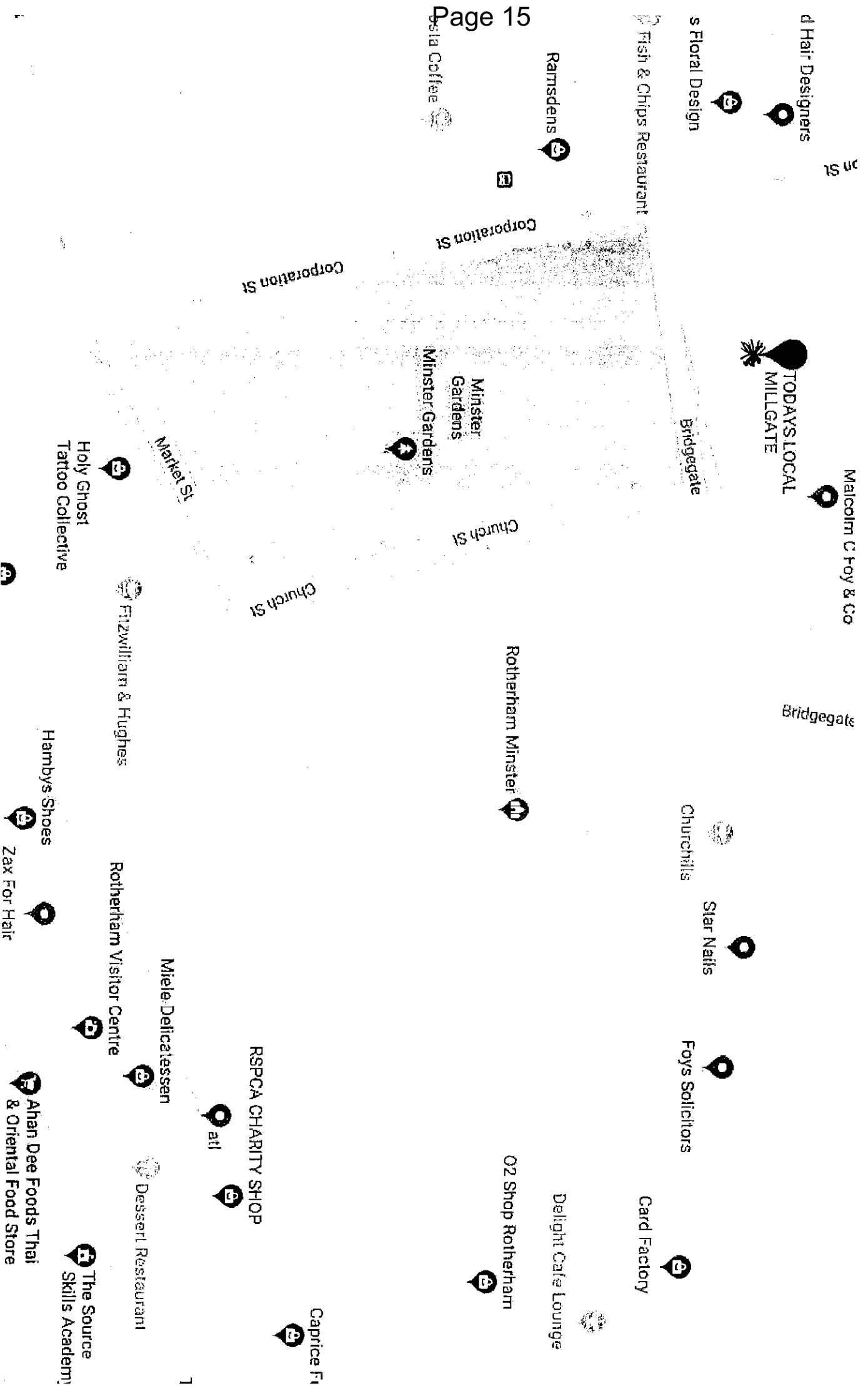

Annex 1 Mandatory Conditions**All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol**

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -
 - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the

vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

I am a Police Constable currently stationed at Riverside House, Main Street, Rotherham within South Yorkshire Police.

I have reviewed all Police incidents relating to 'Today's Express' at 6 Upper Millgate, Rotherham between Tuesday 4th September 2018 and today; Tuesday 13th November 2018. Between these dates there have been 7 incidents reported in relation to the premises. Below is a summary of each incident;

At 18:59 hours on Monday 10th September 2018, a member of staff at Today's Express reported two females who were setting fire to the benches outside the shop. An area search was conducted by officers but the females were not located. Information was passed to the council about the incident.

At 22:15 hours on Monday 17th September 2018 a member of staff at Today's Express reported that a male had entered the store and stolen his mobile phone off the counter. A crime was recorded and CCTV checked from the shop however a suspect could not be identified.

At 21:53 hours on Sunday 30th September 2018 a member of staff reported 3 males had entered the store and stole several boxes of washing powder before running off. A crime was recorded for theft however the suspects could not be identified from the CCTV.

At 16:43 hours on Thursday 18th October 2018 a customer at Today's Express reported a drunk male in the shop attempting to steal a can of alcohol. The operator stated that she briefly spoke with the shop owner who was irate and difficult to understand. The male in question left of his own accord and a crime of theft was recorded.

At 20:58 hours on Thursday 18th October 2018 a member of staff from Today's Express reported that there was a male outside the shop making racist comments towards him and calling him names. Officers attended but the male had left the area. A crime was recorded for racially aggravated public order and the investigation is still ongoing.

At 20:21 hours on Friday 19th October 2018, [REDACTED] reported an incident where a well-known street drinker was involved in an altercation with another male inside Today's Express. This incident was not reported by staff at Today's Express. One of the males was arrested for an unrelated offence.

At 20:46 hours on Saturday 3rd November 2018 a member of staff from Today's Express reported that a group of street drinkers had thrown a knife into the shop when he had asked them to leave. The male had picked the knife up afterwards and walked away. Officers searched the area and stopped a male matching the description. He was searched but no weapons were found.

I am a Police Officer currently based at Rotherham Main Street Police Station in Rotherham.

At approximately 21.15 hours on 18/10/18, I was on duty in full police uniform in company with PC1911 Rumney when we attended an incident at Todays Express, 6 Upper Millgate, Rotherham, S60 1PF. The caller Romana THAVARASA who works there was reporting a male outside saying racist comments.

On arrival the offending male had already left. THAVARASA was unable to down load the CCTV at that time but I obtained a still of the offender on my mobile phone. I asked him to retain the CCTV by producing a copy for me. I then commenced an area search for the offender but this was to no gain. On return to RMSPS I circulated the still I had obtained from the CCTV for identification purposes.

At 19.45 hours on Monday 5th November, 2018 I re attended Todays Express to obtain a statement from THAVARASA and collect the copy of the CCTV footage. However, THAVARASA was not present at work. I was informed by the person working at the time that the CCTV was only stored for 17 days and was no longer available.

I have worked for [REDACTED] for the last 6 years in Rotherham Town Centre. There is a shop called Today's Express on Upper Millgate, Town centre which has been the source of a lot of negative drinking/ anti-social behaviour for a long time now and I have previously given a statement to the council about the issues as I am aware they are looking into their licence. Since I provided the aforementioned statement things have slowed down issue wise, but I believe there are still problems caused by drink, where people are buying

their alcohol from Today's Express. In the last two or three months there have been fights outside the shop: possibly October time there was a group drinking throughout the day (they had been there at opening time and were still there at closing time – a beggar actually approached me from the group but I said "NO" straight away and walked off) and were drinking. They hadn't moved and were constantly drinking and were getting drunker and louder so I believe they were getting their drink from close by and the only real option for buying would have been from Today's Express. A male from this group was absolutely covered in blood and had a large group around him talking to him. I'd say he was drunk due to him staggering about.

Another incident I can recall is, on a separate day to the above incident but around a similar time, a male stood at one of the litter bins just about opposite the shop near to the grassed area, got his penis out in full view and appeared to urinate in the bin. Both me and a colleague I was with at the time were shocked at seeing this. Again, to be doing something like this he had to have been under the influence. The urinating male had been part of the group who again had been sat on the same old benches drinking all day. Last Wednesday, 7th November 2018, we had experienced bad rain, so a group of drinkers (who I

have seen sat on the benches drinking before), were stood in the doorway of Malcolm C Foy, Solicitors. There were five males and one female. They had been drinking whilst stood in the doorway and had been shouting out at other members of the public. There was a black male (with a female who I think was his girlfriend who was white) walking past and I assume they were talking about buying Christmas presents as one of the males from the group then shouted "WHAT YOU GUNNA BUY ME FOR CHRISTMAS YOU BLACK CUNT"), before the whole group burst out laughing. A young lad with a back pack on who walked past minding his own business had the group making kissing noises at him saying "OOH GIVE US A KISS" before laughing again. Another male from the group then disappeared and a short time later, a very short time later came back with a blue carrier bag and got some drink out of it. Just before it, the female in the group begged for some money, managed to get some and then said "SEE, THAT'S HOW IT'S DONE", before the male then then disappeared and came back a short time later with the booze which I believe came from Today's Express due to the carrier bags and how quick he actually was in getting the booze – there isn't anywhere else really that he could get it from and come back in that short a time. Whilst they were stood in the doorway of the solicitors

premise I called the Police. The drinkers saw them and I could hear them say "QUICK GET RID OF YOUR BOOZE" repeatedly as they saw cops approaching them.

The day before, the drinkers were stood in the doorway, there had been an incident where a woman had collapsed and was being tended to by a street warden who had put her in the recovery position. Again, this was close to Today's Express. A male was rubbing the collapsed female's back and then stood up after quite a while doing this, started shouting and swearing at the street warden as though squaring up to him. This went on for what felt like quite a while before the Police arrived (I believe they may have been Community Support Officers) to try and calm him down. As previously described, the next day was the very rainy day where the drinkers were stood in the doorway and the aggressive male was part of this group. His aggressive behaviour was very intimidating to me; I wouldn't have dared approach him.

I believe that, although things may have "slowed down", the shop is still causing problems by selling alcohol. Why else would they choose to sit on the benches as previously described when there are some seating areas just around the corner near the fountains or on the green? Something is attracting them to keep

sitting there and I think it is the alcohol they get from Today's Express as it's close.

On Friday 9th November there were two males sat on the benches, again close to the Solicitor's Offices; one of the males had clearly poured some substance onto the floor as I saw the stain. I also saw this male get out a glass bottle from a blue carrier bag that I believe was either gin or vodka as it was clear, and drink from it. A known tactic they've used in the past is to use pop bottles to hide their drink in and I suspect this male will have poured some of his gin or vodka into the Lucozade bottle (I think it was Lucozade as I did see a bottle left at the side of him). I feel it's disgusting to see this in the Town Centre, especially when on this occasion it was the school holidays. I believe he had bought the drink from Today's Express again because of the proximity and blue carrier bag I've come to associate with the shop.

1. I am a Police Constable serving with South Yorkshire Police, currently Posted in the Anti-Social Behaviour unit with Rotherham Borough Council.
2. From records I have access to, in relation Todays Express, Upper Millgate, Rotherham Town Centre, I can confirm that,
3. On 3rd July 2018 at 20.30pm, a female enters the store and begins throwing items around causing damage to them. Staff are aware who the suspect is but refuse to make a formal complaint
4. On 11th July 2018 at 20.45pm staff report a known male street drinker has come into the store and been racially abusive towards the victim. As the male has left the store, he has punched some advertising signs. Staff have refused to make a complaint. It is explained to staff that by failing to take any formal action then it was hindering the police being able to tackle problems in the town centre . The victim said they understood and agreed if there were any further incidents they would make a formal complaint
5. On 9th August 2018 at 17.00pm store report to a police patrol that street drinkers have been causing a nuisance outside the store. They have asked them to move on and they have been abusive and a male has made the comment "WIND YOUR NECK IN , ASK THE ASIAN ONE TO COME OUT , YOU'LL GET HURT" . The suspect has been identified but the staff have refused to make a complaint. Again staff have been informed of the ongoing

issues at the location and by not supporting police action police are unable to deal with the ongoing issues and repeat offenders

6. Later that day 18.03pm a male is arrested outside Todays Express for being drunk and disorderly and assaults a police officer in the process. A member of the public contacts 999 to say the officer is being surrounded and they fear for his safety. They are so concerned they contact the police again later to check on his welfare.
 7. On 15th August 2018 a member of the public reports that a male is outside Todays Express and they are in possession of a butterfly knife. Officers attend and a female is detained in possession of the knife.
 8. On 19th August 2018 at 16.20pm, staff at Todays Express contact the police. They said they there was a female in the shop smashing it up. The female could be heard screaming in the background. The female leaves the store and sits on the benches outside. The staff are advised to lock the door but they say they are unable to. There is a further call as the female is alleged to have been shouting, swearing and making racist comments. The shop owner does lock the door but keeps opening it when customers approach. The female manages to get back inside the shop. The victim names the offender and there is CCTV of the incident but they refuse to make a complaint
 9. On 1st September 2018 at 17.26pm the staff contact police as a male in the shop has been refused alcohol and is refusing to leave. He had apparently stolen a can earlier in the day but had paid for it but wanted more alcohol
 10. On 10th September 2018 at 18.49pm staff from the shop contact police. Youths have been outside the store trying to set fire to the benches. They have extinguished the fires but the youths keep starting them again. When officers attend the youths have left but the benches are damaged.
 11. On 17th September 2018 at 22.15pm a staff member contacts police as a customer has stolen their mobile phone
 12. On 30th September 2018 at 21.53pm, staff contact police and state that three males have entered the store and one was armed with a knife. They have then stolen 10 boxes of washing powder. Police attend and no knife has actually been seen and the stolen goods recovered
 13. On 15th October 2018 at 18.09pm, a wanted male is detained outside the store. He is drunk and has to be taken to hospital first regarding an injury to his head
 14. On 18th October 2018 at 16.43pm, a member of the public reports that there is a drunken male in the store trying to shoplift alcohol and causing a scene. Officers try to speak with staff member who is irate and angry
-

15. Later that day at 20.58pm staff contact police as a male is outside the shop making racist comments .They state he is shouting "paki b*****ds and has broken a sign 14/152345/18
16. On 19th October 2018 at 20.21pm [REDACTED] has breached his Criminal Behaviour Order by being on Upper Millgate and entering Today's Express
17. There has been a reduction in Anti-Social Behaviour in Rotherham Town Centre but this due to other measures that South Yorkshire Police have taken.
18. [REDACTED] is the main protagonist of anti-social behaviour in the town centre. For a number of weeks he had bail conditions not to enter the area and there was an immediate reduction in incidents. On 15th October 2018, [REDACTED] was given a Criminal Behaviour Order. One of the conditions is not to be on Upper Millgate
19. On 19th October 2018 after being released from court that morning for breach of his CBO [REDACTED] breached it again by being on Upper Millgate and he actually entered Todays Express. Officers had been alerted to the fact he was present as some kind of altercation has occurred outside the shop.
20. On 19th October 2018, I was present at Sheffield Magistrates for [REDACTED] court appearance. He told the Magistrate that he attended on Upper Millgate to purchase "the cheap and nasty alcohol". He told her it was the only place he could actually purchase alcohol from and believed this was valid excuse to breach his order
21. On 19th October 2018 anther street drinker, [REDACTED] who was a customer of Todays Express was also given a Criminal Behaviour Order. His order prevents him from entering Rotherham Town Centre in its entirety and from having an open vessel of alcohol anywhere in a public place. This is due to the violent and sometimes racist offences he has he has committed in the town centre
22. On 28th September 2018 a Civil Injunction was also granted against two women who frequented Todays Express and one of their conditions is not to be in Upper Millgate
23. I believe the contents of this statement to be true and I understand it may be placed before the court as evidence.

Further to my statements in relation to the Today's Local premises in Rotherham, I now add the following.


At approximately 0830hrs on Tuesday 11th December 2018, I attended at Today's Local, 6 Upper Millgate, Rotherham, in order to conduct a check in preparation for the pending Licence review.

The male in charge at the premises was a man who I know to be called RAM who is the DPS.

I immediately noticed there were a small quantity of boxes stacked up by the rear fore door. Whilst the boxes were not directly in front of the door, they were adjacent to it in the hallway and clearly restricting the passage of persons should they wish to exit

hastily. I have advised the premises many times previously regarding the blocking of the fire exits and I again advised RAM they boxes must be removed forthwith. He proceeded to remove the boxes and stated they had just had a delivery.

I then asked which staff were currently employed at the premises. RAM mentioned the name Vicri. I did not recognise that name and I asked who he was. RAM advised me he had been employed very recently, but could not tell me his name. I asked to see the staff training records. As I was doing so, another member of staff, Michelle Walker arrived at the premises to start work. I asked her how long Vikri had been employed. She advised me he had been there a few weeks.

I was then handed the staff training records for VICRI.

I have copied the records and they are exhibited at TAB 5.

The records clearly show a signature dated 15th October and there are a number of questions which had answers written in pen. I asked RAM who did the training. He stated he did it together with another member of staff called Ewan. I asked who had written the answers. He stated it was Ewan who had written the answers as Vicri was unable to write.

I then asked why the questions had not been marked and also why there were no signatures other than Vicri's. He was unable to answer this.

I advised him I was not satisfied that the training had been properly carried out. He was unable to comment further.

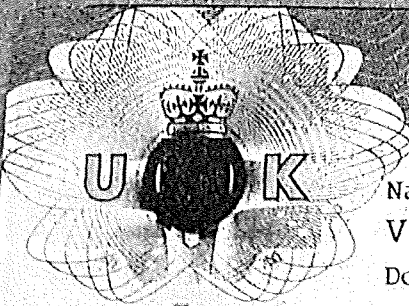



1. I am a Police Constable serving with South Yorkshire Police, currently Posted in the Anti-Social Behaviour unit with Rotherham Borough Council.
2. From records I have access to, in relation Todays Express, Upper Millgate, Rotherham Town Centre, I can confirm that,
3. On 3rd November 2018 at 20.46pm staff from the shop contact police. A male who had been sat on the benches outside had walked into the shop and thrown a knife on the floor. He had picked it up and then gone and sat outside again on the benches
4. On 7th November 2018 at 15.31pm, staff from Malcolm C Foys contact police. There is a group of 4-5 males and a female sat on the benches drinking alcohol. They are shouting and swearing and disturbing their customers. They do not want to go out and ask them to stop as the previous day the same group had been very aggressive towards them
5. On 11th November 2018 at 20.26pm, a member Todays staff calls police. They state that someone is setting off fireworks near the church. They are asked for further details and descriptions but the caller states they have to go and serve customers so cannot offer any more information
6. On 14th November 2018 at 16.25pm, police receive an abandoned 999 call. On calling the number back it is Todays Express who have detained a female

stealing alcohol. They had retrieved the cans and the female was already barred from the store

7. At 18.55pm on the same day Todays Express, contact the CCTV room repeatedly asking for camera room but not stating why. They finally state they had issues with a customer but they had now left
8. On 24th November 2018 at 21.58pm, a member of the public reports an attempted robbery. They had been on Upper Millgate and two males had been fighting outside Todays Express. One of the males has then approached the victim asked him for money and then punched him to the ribs and shoulder. The victim has run away and got on a bus and reported the incident to police. He describes the offender as being "very much in drink"
23. I believe the contents of this statement to be true and I understand it may be placed before the court as evidence.

I am a Police Constable with South Yorkshire Police currently stationed at Riverside House, Main Street, Rotherham.

On Tuesday 13th November 2018, I was on duty in full uniform and in a marked police vehicle in company with colleagues when we were requested to attend an incident within Rotherham Town Centre where a number of young persons had been seen Free Running on the roofs of business premises.

While colleagues were speaking with a male I had located I was stood on Upper Millgate outside the Todays Express store, while there I was approached by a well know female Town Centre Drunk. The female was unsteady on her feet, her eyes were glazed and her speech was slurred and I could smell intoxicants on her breath, I formed the belief she was drunk.

The female asked me not to seize her alcohol, as she was just going home, but before she did this she was going to get some more, I advised the female that as long as she caused no issues and left the area I wouldn't seized her single can of alcohol which was unopened.

The female then left her can of alcohol, which was in a bag but clearly visable, on the bench outside Todays Express and entered the shop. As I was stood directly outside the entrance to Todays Express I could see

within, I observed the female walk down the aisle to the far end, she selected a can from the shelf area and approached the till area.

The staff member behind the counter was a lone male worker who appeared to be Asian in appearance and appeared to be speaking with the female who was the only person in the shop. Once I had formed the belief, the shop assistant was going to serve the female alcohol I entered the store and using a raised voice said the following:

1724 – "I hope you're going to confirm the female isn't drunk prior to serving her and committing an offence"

I then turned around and exited the store, once outside I again watched while the assistant then refused to serve the female. The female then exited the store and stated "He's not fucking serving me beer because of you", she then collected her belonging from the bench and left the area.

I was satisfied that the shop assistant was going to serve the female due to his actions and the fact he was trying to scan the item she had placed on the till area.
