VN to circulate presentation.</li> <li><u>Themes:</u> Infrastructure for blue, green and energy Infrastructure for connectivity Placemaking – roads, streets, gateways Urban growing Skills, enterprise and culture Residential – live, work, homes TMA said that Option A was exciting and would link into the College's curriculum. DB said that Grimm &amp; Co., would support Option A. SM added that there are some very positive emerging themes. PW asked if there were any other options in between the radical Option A and much less so Option B? DAP said it is important the correct strategy is used to engage with the landowners. RP confirmed that initial discussions have taken place. NB mentioned other points highlighted outside these Board meetings; linchpin sites/sites that can attract extra funding and provide a balance between long term investment and what can be delivered quickly, linking into Covid recovery.</li></ul>	VN
