5. Summary

This report advises Cabinet Member on the level of highway damage caused by the recent extreme winter weather and details the action taken and proposed to address the situation.

6. Recommendation:

That the report and the action to address the identified “Priority Damage” be approved.

7. Proposals and Details

(i) Background

In December, January and February we experienced a period of extreme winter weather that is reported to be the worst event for 30 years. The freeze/thaw action associated with this weather has dramatically accelerated the deterioration of our highway network to the extent that it has left considerable lengths of carriageway in need of urgent repair, and created many more dangerous defects than would normally be experienced.

This is a national problem and the Cabinet Member will be aware that the Local Government Association has written to the Department for Transport seeking £100 Million of emergency funding to be advanced from funds budgeted for next financial year, in order to help finance the most urgent repairs. Other recent headline reports include estimates from Northamptonshire County Council and Harrow Council of £5 Million and £2 Million respectively needed to address damage as a direct result of the winter conditions together with North Yorkshire County Council proposing a last-minute increase in council tax to generate an extra £1 Million for highway repairs.

(ii) Action taken to address the situation

- a) There has been a large increase in the number of potholes requiring immediate attention. In the four working weeks in January 2010, a total of 3,639 potholes were made safe compared with 1,063 in the same period last year. The situation only improved marginally in February with 3390 potholes repaired compared with 1154 in February 2009 (note that February last year included a period of relatively severe snow/frost). Additional workforce teams have been deployed onto this work together with some overtime working in order to ensure that we comply with the basic duty of the Council as Highway Authority to maintain highways safe for traffic.
- b) Emergency rapid inspection of the highway network has been carried out. This has focused on identifying carriageways with urgent winter damage only and has been carried out with greater attention given to the “precautionary gritting routes” (i.e. mainly the classified network, bus routes and main spine routes through residential areas). Appendix A identifies the areas of damaged carriageway in each Ward. The priority of repair has been ranked on the following basis/order:
 - “**Priority Damage**” (this damage is the most urgent and includes locations where the integrity of the carriageway is so poor that it is difficult to fill potholes effectively and meet the duty to keep the highway safe)
 - “**Other Severe Damage (1)**” – on the precautionary route

- “**Other Severe Damage (2)**” – on the non-precautionary route
- c) As shown in Appendix B, all of the urgent damage identified has been costed and a proposed programme developed to repair the £686,000 of “**Priority Damage**” over the 10 weeks available between the main thaw after the end of the coldest period (i.e. at week commencing 18th January 2010) and the end of the financial year. A significant amount of effort has been expended in successfully identifying additional funding sources and this urgent highest ranking patching repair work can be funded this year as follows:

Basic Highway Maintenance Revenue Budget	£222,000

- d) Appendix B also shows the following severe damage caused by the exceptional winter conditions:

“ Other Severe Damage (1) ” – precautionary routes	£179,000
“ Other Severe Damage (2) ” –non-precautionary routes	£197,000
TOTAL for “Other Severe Damage”	£376,000

No funding source (this financial year) has yet been identified for this other work categorised as “**other severe damage**” and currently any repairs are held on a reserve list.

8. Finance

Fuller details of each of the funding sources contributing to the £686,000 of “**Priority Damage**” repairs are as follows:

- Basic Highway Maintenance Budget £222,000: This is the remaining funding available for patching repairs in the Streetpride Basic Highway Maintenance budget at 18th January 2010 (i.e. the remainder left after commitment for pothole repairs, etc.)
- Principal Road Capital Funding: It is proposed that some programmed work on the principal road network is deferred and £156,000 of capital funding be used to carry out repairs to “**Priority Damage**” on the principal road network.

This has been limited to £156,000 because of the pressure already on that capital programme to deliver the Local Area Agreement Stretch Targets for improvement of condition of Rotherham's principal roads.

- Savings in Streetpride's Revenue Budget (2009/10): Outturn savings of £158,000 have been identified (including an estimated £90,000 deriving from the interim disposal arrangements for green waste under an agreement with Barnsley and Doncaster Councils) and it is proposed that these are applied to fund the "**Priority Damage**" repairs.
- £150,000 of Rotherham Economic Regeneration Fund revenue funding: Having regard to the impact of better highway condition in helping safeguard sustainable economic growth together with the temporary creation of additional construction jobs, Cabinet Member for Economic Development Planning and Transportation approved an application for £150,000 on 1 March 2010.

No funding has been identified for the £376,000 for work in the category of "*Other Severe Damage*" and it may have to be funded from the 2010/11 Basic Highway Maintenance budget. In addition, planned patching work (estimated at approximately £80,000) normally carried out in March prior to surface treatment programmes that commence in May will have to be deferred and funded from the 2010/11 Basic Highway Maintenance budget. In order to limit the detrimental impact of the repair of the outstanding exceptional winter damage on normal basic highway maintenance in 2010/11; an application will be made against the Maintenance/Minor Strategic Capital Funding that may be available in 2010/11.

In addition, the extreme weather has greatly increased the cost of Winter Maintenance this year. Currently (prior to budget monitoring period 11) the outturn for Winter Maintenance is estimated at £931,000 compared with a budget of £565,554. This over-spend is being met from the £150,000 in the Winter Maintenance reserve account together with £215,446 from savings in Streetpride.

Note: no provision has yet been made in the 2010/11 budget to reinstate the winter maintenance reserve.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

Despite the fact that Rotherham's measured road condition is better than the South Yorkshire average, unfortunately public satisfaction with highway condition in Rotherham is very low (22% in Reachout 18 in 2008).

Notwithstanding the successful funding of the "*Priority Damage*" (£686,000) repairs this financial year, risks associated with deferral of the £376,000 of "*Other Severe Damage*" [referred to in section 7 (d)] above include:

- That the severity of the damage, cost of repairs and insurance claims could increase in 2010/11 as timely repairs were not made when the damage occurred
- Deferral of the remaining £376,000 of “*Other Severe Damage*” repairs and the £80,000 of pre-patching work to 2010/11 together with other major fixed costs against the budget (such as potholing, grubbing, vegetation removal etc. at an approximate cost of £350,000) will commit about 85% of the Basic Highway Maintenance budget (£963,360 in 2009/10) and leave little available to tackle normal highway patching repairs over the full year including winter 2010/11.
- That despite the Council’s commitment to the enhanced Principal Roads Maintenance Programme (an additional £5 million capital investment over 3 years) and the imminent completion of the £4 million reconstruction of Centenary Way, it is possible that the public may perceive the delay in addressing the “*Other Severe Damage*” together with any reduced spending on normal patching works in 2010/11 as a continuing reason to be dissatisfied with highway condition.

In view of the necessarily rapid nature of the emergency highway inspection work undertaken and the continuing cold winter conditions, it is possible that damage identified in the report could be an under-estimate of the eventual liability.

Every effort is being made to maintain the programme of work to ensure that the “*Priority Damage*” is repaired by the end of this financial year. However, unfortunately a number of factors are impacting on progress and these include:

- Continuing winter conditions: This not only delays the progress of repairs but in addition lorry drivers on night-time winter gritting duties often have to be stood down on rest in the day and this reduces the labour resources available for repairs
- Stolen gully covers: Since November 2009, 264 gully covers have been stolen from the public highway and the labour resource needed to replace the covers is considerable
- In recent weeks two fissures have opened up in highways in Maltby. Significant resources are deployed on making safe, traffic diversions and coordinating repairs with British Coal and the Utilities.

Our Strategic Partner, Ringway has risen to the challenge and at short notice has undertaken to carry out approximately £170,000 of the “*Priority Damage*” repairs before the end of the financial year.

10. Policy and Performance Agenda Implications

- **Rotherham Safe** – It is the duty of the Council as Highway Authority to maintain highways safe for the traffic that wishes to use them. Once roads have failed structurally their future performance can be unpredictable.

Deterioration can take place rapidly and local defects such as potholes can appear almost overnight.

- Good quality road surfaces contribute towards **Rotherham Achieving** (through transport being a key element for regeneration), **Rotherham Alive** (through the impact of road condition on the street scene and local quality of life) and **Rotherham Proud** (by assisting in the presentation of a positive external and internal image for the borough)
- Satisfaction with highway condition could have a bearing on performance under the Comprehensive Area Assessment.

11. Background Papers and Consultation

Financial Services has approved financial details in this report.

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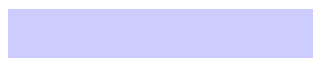

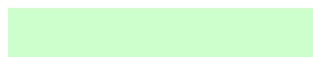
