

#### LICENSING BOARD Wednesday, 16th November, 2011

Present:- Councillor Wootton (in the Chair); Councillors Andrews, Barron, Beck, Buckley, Dodson, Foden, Goulty, Jack, McNeely, Nightingale, Read and Swift.

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Donaldson, Falvey, J. Hamilton, N. Hamilton, Havenhand, P. A. Russell and Sangster.

#### Q28. MINUTES

Resolved:- That the minutes of the meeting of the Licensing Board held on 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2011 be approved as a correct record for signature by the Chairman.

#### Q29. SINGLE ROTHERHAM DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACE ORDER

Consideration was given to a report presented by Steve Parry, Neighbourhood Crime and Justice Manager, which asked for determination as to whether or not to progress the making of a single multi-location Designated Public Place Order across the Borough requested by the Safer Rotherham Partnership's Joint Action Group.

In the creation of an Order, the Police would be provided with additional discretionary powers to stop the consumption of alcoholic drinks. The powers would make it an offence for, when requested, someone not to stop drinking and/or surrender their drink. The powers were used to address alcohol related nuisance, annoyance or public disorder.

The proposal had been previously considered in meetings of the Area Assembly Chairs, Overview and Scrutiny Management Board and the Cabinet Member for Safe and Attractive Neighbourhoods on the 6<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2011 respectively. At all meetings the proposal was supported for progression.

Should the Licensing Board be in favour of a Single Designated Public Place Order then the Director of Housing and Neighbourhood Services would be responsible for implementing the consultation process, including the publication of a notice in a local newspaper inviting representations as to whether or not the Order should be made.

Further information was provided on the legal position, requirements of making a Designated Public Place Order, the evidential position and assessment and the next steps that could be taken.

The Licensing Board welcomed the position to move towards a Single Order, but emphasised the risk of raising public expectation and the circumstances in which the Order would apply. It was also suggested that clarification be provided as to the powers assigned to the Police Community Support Officers and whether there was to be consideration to extend their powers of enforcement. Resolved:- (1) That the request by the Safer Rotherham Partnership's Joint Action Group for the Council to establish a single multi location Designated Public Place Order be noted.

(2) That, once the area to be designated was confirmed, the making of the proposed Designated Public Places Order be progressed and consultation, as prescribed by the Local Authorities (Alcohol Consumption in Public Places) Regulations 2001, be undertaken.

(3) That a future report be submitted to the Licensing Board on the representations made during the consultative process to enable, if supported, the Council to establish a single multi-location Designated Public Places Order for Rotherham.

#### Q30. EXCLUSION OF THE PRESS AND PUBLIC

Resolved:- That, under Section 100A[4] of the Local Government Act 1972, the press and public be excluded from the meeting for the following items of business on the grounds that they involve the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in the Police Act 1997 and Paragraphs 3 and 7 of Part I of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (business affairs and prevention of crime).

#### Q31. HACKNEY CARRIAGE/PRIVATE HIRE DRIVERS' LICENCES

Messrs. N.R. and S.A. attended the meeting and were interviewed by the Board.

Resolved:- (1) That the hackney carriage/private hire driver's licences and private hire operator's licence held by Mr. N.R. be revoked.

(2) That the private hire operator's licence held by Mr. S.A. be revoked.

(3) That the application by Mr. M.S. be refused.

#### 5. Summary

This report concerns applications made for proposed House to House collection Promoters permits in or about the Borough of Rotherham.

Where a person who is promoting, or proposes to promote, a collection in any locality for a charitable purpose makes an application to the authority for the area in the prescribed manner specifying the purpose of the collection and the locality within which the collection is to be made, and furnishes them with the prescribed information, the authority shall, subject to the provisions of the act, grant to them a licence authorising them to "promote" a collection within that locality for that purpose.

"Promoter" means, in relation to a collection, a person who causes others to act as collectors for the purposes of the collection.

Application for a hackney-carriage or private-hire licence

No collection for a charitable purpose may be made in the locality unless the applicant is an appropriately licensed promoter by this authority, or holds an exemption granted by the Secretary of State from obtaining a licence from this authority.

The attention of applicants for licences under the House to House Collections Act is drawn to Paragraph 4 of the House to House Collections Regulations 1947 made by the Secretary of State on the 12 December 1947. This paragraph provides that ordinarily an application for licence shall be made not later than the first day of the month preceding that in which it is proposed to commence the collection.

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Clothes Aid Group has been refused a licence by Birmingham City Council to collect for Make-A-Wish.

The refusal by Birmingham City Council was appealed to the Minister and that appeal in turn was refused. Clothes Aid Group issued proceedings before the High Court to judicially review this decision. The appeal decision by the Minister has been quashed by Consent Order of the High Court. This is as a result of the Minister conceding a point on the nature of the Minister's functions on appeal.

In light of the delays, Make-A-Wish sought and the Minister has now granted a national exemption order under section 3 of the House to House Collections Act 1939 under which Clothes Aid Group acts. Given this a licence from Birmingham City Council is no longer needed.
