On 29th October 2014 the Policy was changed so that only those in housing need could join the Housing Register, reducing the list by over 10,000. On 24th July 2015 – creation of a new band 4 to allow people who are not in housing need to bid for these low-demand properties. February 2017 – report to Cabinet proposing a further 6 changes, which aim to increase tenancy sustainability, reduce expenditure in respect of void costs and rent allowances. The will also help to prepare for changes brought about by the Welfare Reform and Work Act 2016 and the pending Homelessness Reduction Bill which will amend the Housing Act 1996 to make provision about measures for reducing homelessness. There will alternative delivery mechanisms to cater for people's needs e.g. online workshops for those who live outside the Borough such as people leaving the armed forces. In exceptional circumstances rent allowances will be issued. The criteria for this would be applicants who are placed in Band 1 in financial difficulties, or homeless applicants living in temporary accommodation, or safeguarding cases.
