2.1 Community Safety Partnerships (CSP) are statutory bodies established by the Crime and Disorder Reduction Act. The Safer Rotherham Partnership (SRP) is the Boroughs CSP and fulfils the statutory requirements placed on CSPs. Contained within the same Act, was the legal requirement for annual scrutiny by the Council in relation to the discharge of the functions of the CSP.
