This project will replace the two bridges connecting Parkgate Shopping Centre and tram stop with Eastwood with one accessible bridge. At either side of the bridge the environment will be improved to create safer routes including a new play area at Eldon Road playing fields and dedicated pathway leading from the bridge into Parkgate Shopping Centre.

• Key findings

Current infrastructure arrangements between Eastwood and Parkgate are not accessible to those with mobility restrictions, thus limiting active travel and encouraging car use.

Actions

A detailed communication and consultation delivery plan is in development. This will detail how the improvements will impact on all members of the community with the inclusion of measurable targets for engagement throughout project development and end use.

Targeted engagement with protected characteristics groups will begin post Business Case in the detailed development of designs ensuring the new bridge is fully accessible.
