The Play Area Improvement Programme has to date responded to casework requests identifying local need as it arises. The remainder is proposed to address a backlog of health and safety issues identified through inspection records and is applied universally across the borough. All play areas are maintained to British Standard ensuring an equal standard of provision. As repairs are undertaken care is taken to ensure the introduction of additional accessible play equipment to ensure access for all children and young people.

All proposed improvement have or will be consulted on with local Ward Members at the tie of undertaking to ensure they are appropriate to the needs of the local community. All caseworks relating to play equipment have been responded to as part of the first wave of the improvements.

Could the proposal have implications regarding the accessibility of services to the whole or wider community?

As the Play Area Improvement Programme is delivered consideration is given in each location to improving greater disability access. Many of the improvements already undertaken have included accessible play equipment where space allows and more is planned within the proposed improvements.

Could the proposal affect service users?

During the programme certain areas may be out of action while improvements take place. The service will aim for repairs and replacements to be undertake as swiftly as possible with minimal disruption to the surrounding parkland.

How have you considered equality and diversity?

The aim of the Play Area Improvement Plan is to ensure safe and easy access to high quality play provision within five minutes' walk for all children and young people. Ensuring all families have access to play provision locally promotes increased physical activity and

boots mental health and wellbeing. In addition, where space allows, a number of play areas have also received accessible play equipment to support greater disability access.

Key findings

The Play Area Improvement Programme aims to make a positive contribution to localities across the borough with investment in 28 of the 35 play areas owned by the Council's Green Spaces service. Where space allows consideration has been given to the introduction of accessible play equipment ensuring that play is available for disabled children on their doorstep and integrated within the main play area.

The programme will ensure that play equipment is repaired or replaced to maintain the quality and quantity of equipment available to support healthy lifestyles in young people.

Actions

The service will undertake the following actions:

- Assess each play area for the potential to incorporate accessible play as part of any repair or replacement programme
- Work closely with colleagues in Neighbourhoods and Elected Members to identify the most appropriate play equipment for local need.
