Clifton Park have been approached by a concert management company; FKP Scorpio o host a concert by Rotherham based band The Reytons in July 2024. The concert would be wholly managed by FKP Scorpio on a commercial basis with liaison with RESAG and Culture Sport and Tourism. A licence has been granted for the concert with no objections for up to 20000. Preparation (and take down) for the concert will involve temporary closure of parts of the park, including the Doncaster Road car park between 1 st and 10 th July 2024.
