Racecourse Road, Rotherham – Proposed Road humps.

We have recently undertaken an informal consultation on a proposal to construct road humps along the full length of Racecourse Road and would like to take the opportunity to thank all those that commented on the proposal.

We are now moving to the formal consultation process where details of the proposed traffic calming features will be advertised on site and in the local press shortly to increase awareness of the scheme.

Upon completion all comments and objections received, (from both the informal and formal consultations), will be reported to the Assistant Director of Regeneration & Environment for a decision to be made regarding progressing the scheme as shown on the attached plan (Drawing reference number: 122/21640/HT/02).

The proposed road humps will be 75mm high, five metres long flat top road humps with tapered sides in the vicinity of Rockingham Court, property numbers: 32, 48, 72, 92, 116, 138 and near the Wath Wood Road junction. All the proposed humps will be positioned so as not to obstruct private driveways or accesses and there are no double or single yellow lines proposed at these, therefore existing parking provision will not be affected.

The scheme has been developed following a suggestion made by your local Councillors to the Local Neighbourhood Road Safety Scheme Fund which has been set up in Rotherham to address community concerns. In this case the road is frequently the subject of complaints regarding speeding traffic, it is used by pedestrians accessing nearby local facilities and for leisure purposes. This proposal will reduce the average speed of vehicles on the road and also better reflect and indicate to users the speed at which it is safer to travel through this residential area.

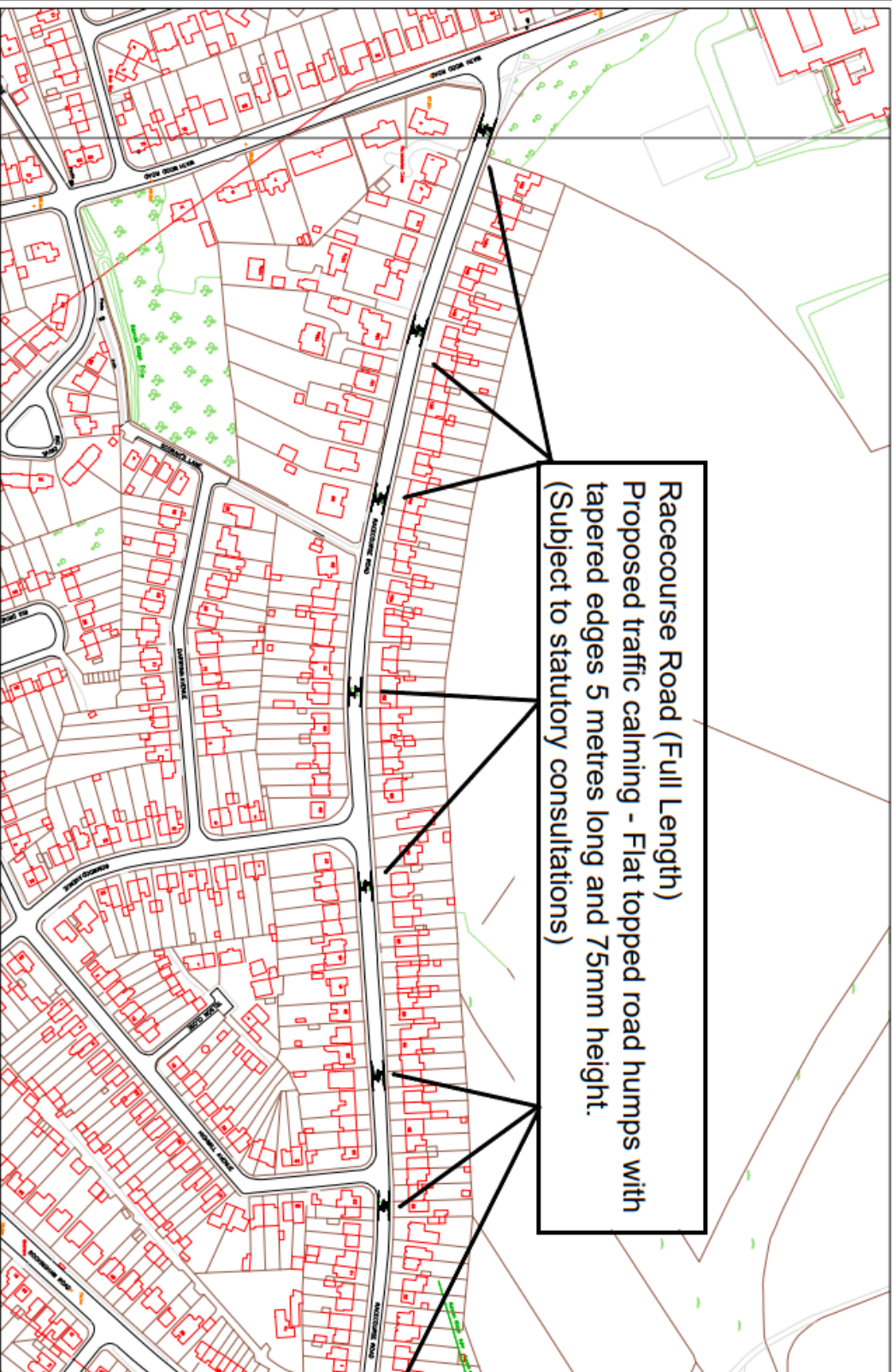
