 - *Impact*: identify, in relation to each area, whether the decision of the proposal does the following: *reduces emissions*, *increases emissions*, or has *no impact on emissions*. If it is uncertain this section can be labelled *impact unknown*
 - If *no impact on emissions* is identified: no further detail is needed for this area, but can be added if relevant (e.g. if efforts have been made to mitigate emissions in this area.)
 - Describe impacts or potential impacts on emissions: two sections deal respectively with emissions from the Council (including those of contractors), and emissions across Rotherham as a whole. In both sections please explain any factors that are likely to reduce or increase emissions.  - In most cases there is no need to quantify the emission impact of an area after outlining the factors that may reduce or increase emissions. In some cases, however, this may be desirable if factors can be reduced to a small number of known variables (e.g. if an emission impact is attached to a known or estimated quantity of fuel consumed).
 - Describe any measures to mitigate emission impact: regardless of the emission impact, in many cases steps should be taken in order to reduce mitigate all emissions associated with each area as far as possible; these steps can be outlined here (For example: if a proposal is likely to increase emissions but practices or materials have been adopted in order to reduce this overall impact, this would be described here).
 - Outline any monitoring of emission impacts that will be carried out: in this section outline any steps taken to monitor emission levels, or steps taken to monitor the factors that are expected to increase or reduce emission levels (for example, if waste or transport levels are being monitored this would be described here)
- A *summary paragraph* outlining the likely overall impacts of the proposal/decision on emissions should then be completed this is not required if the proposal/decision has no impact across all areas.
- The supporting information section should be filled as followed:
 - Author/completing officer
 - *Research, data, or information* may refer to datasets, background documents, literature, consultations, or other data-gathering exercise. These should also be added to the *supporting documents* section of the cabinet report
- Carbon Impact Assessments are to be appended to the associated cabinet reports
- Prior to publishing reports, Carbon Impact Assessments should be sent to <u>climate@rotherham.gov.uk</u> for feedback

Appendix I of the Policy (updated 2023) specifies enhanced quality standards for vehicles, including a requirement that vehicles should comply with or exceed Euro 6 emissions standards. Euro 6 sets a target for vehicle manufacturers, that all vehicles sold in a year should produce no more than 98g CO ₂ per km, on average. As such any modal shift between Hackney carriages and private hire vehicles due to increased tariffs and charges is expected to have only a small carbon impact.	Emissions tests of Hackney carriages and private hire vehicles are required as part of compliance tests, for all vehicles licensed by the Council.	The licensing team will make amendments to the application process to enhance the vehicle information that is obtained – this will include emissions data / propulsion / EU category etc. In addition, the results of emissions testing will also be recorded at the point that the test is carried out at the Council's testing centre. This information will allow for an assessment of the emissions performance of the Hackney carriage and private hire
