1. Background

- 1.1 On 7th August 2023 Cabinet approved the enabling works for the Rotherham Markets and Library development and delegated authority to the Strategic Director of Regeneration of Environment, in consultation with the S151 Officer and the Cabinet Member for Jobs and Local Economy, to award contract(s) for the works.
- 1.2 The Council and Henry Boot Construction Ltd (HBC) subsequently agreed an enabling works scope and fee and a NEC works contract was signed. This set out the terms on which the contract and associated construction works would be governed, including how payments can be drawn down by HBC following delivery of the enabling works.
- 1.3 This contract agreement allowed for preparatory works for the Rotherham Markets and Library redevelopment to begin, with mobilisation taking place in September 2023.
- 1.4 This report seeks the approval of the Strategic Director for Regeneration and Environment, in consultation with the S151 Officer and the Cabinet Member for Jobs and Local Economy to extend the enabling works contract in line with the revised programme dates presented at Cabinet on 18 December 2023.

2. Key Issues

- 2.1 The initial end date for the enabling works contract was set as 31 December 2023 with the expectation that the main works contract would be agreed in December 2023 and take precedence. Due to the requirement for an extensive value engineering exercise for the main redevelopment works, this is now not programmed to be agreed and commence until 25 March 2024.
- 2.2 To ensure delivery of works on site can continue and the existing programme can be maintained, consideration of an extension to the existing enabling works contract is required.

3. Options considered and recommended proposal

- 3.1 This report focuses on the extension of the previously agreed enabling works contract with HBC exercising the delegated authority approved by Cabinet on 07 August 2023.
- 3.2 This contract was agreed as an Option A under NEC4 terms. NEC4 is considered a highly robust construction contract, enabling best practices in procurement and flexibility in delivery, and, as such, will provide market standard security for the Council.
- 3.3 Extending the existing contract will allow HBC to continue delivery on site and secure the existing programme and costings provided. Therefore, this is the recommended option.
- 3.4 The alternative option is not to extend the enabling works contract. This option is not recommended, because it will create programme delay while the main works contract is agreed, which will result in further costs being incurred

3.5 It is recommended that:

1. The contract duration in respect of enabling works is extended by the Council and confirmed with Henry Boot Construction Ltd.

4. Consultation on proposal

4.1 The report relates to the agreement of commercial terms and includes information that is commercially sensitive. Public consultation is not applicable in this context, however, extensive engagement and consultation with a wide range of stakeholders was undertaken on the Markets and Library development project throughout the entire design period.

13. Risks and Mitigation

- 13.1 A comprehensive risk register has been prepared for this project and is monitored and updated by the Council's Building Design Team acting as Principal Designer for the redevelopment. Henry Boot Construction Ltd also maintain their own construction risk register that is shared with the Council, this focuses on programme and construction related challenges and mitigations.
- 13.2 Impact on existing Council services operating on the current site is a considered risk with this decision. This risk has been managed through careful selection of the final scope of works included in the enabling works

contract to ensure harm or impact on the ability of the Markets service to carry out their responsibilities is minimised.
