The proposals relate to the reorganisation of Riverside House accommodation to better use the office space. All services will remain in the same building with some Council services and staff relocating to different floors or wings of the building.

The vacant space will then be leased to NHS health partners who are bringing staff from outlying buildings in the Borough and from buildings outside of the Borough into a more central location which will allow for better access to services and wider collaboration with the Council.

Key findings
