Naming of pitches at Rother Valley Country Park after Millie Bright OBE

1. Background

- 1.1 Killamarsh Dynamos was founded in 1981 and has leased pitches at Rother Valley Country Park on a 25-year basis from 2017. They operate two full size and two junior pitches, with room for expansion. They are a Charter Standard Development Club with FA qualified coaches and a strong safeguarding ethos. They accommodate 16 teams from U7 to U18, including girls only teams and run several inexpensive weekly training sessions for children and young people in the area.
- 1.2 The Football Foundation is the charity of the Premier League, the Football Association and Government. They deliver grassroots sports facilities to help transform communities where need is greatest. As part of this remit, they are supporting delivery of government plans to rename grassroots football facilities in honour of, and as a legacy of, the England women's team's successes in Euro 2022.

2. Key Issues

- 2.1 Mike Atherton, the Chair of the Club, has been approached by the Football Foundation to rename one of the leased pitches in honour of Millie Bright OBE; the Chelsea captain and England star played for Killamarsh Dynamos until age 16, is fondly remembered at the Club and retains close links to the area.
- 2.2 The Club's membership has been consulted widely and is strongly in favour of the proposal.
- 2.3 The land-owning service at Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (Green Spaces, Culture Sport and Tourism, Regeneration and Environment) is fully supportive of this proposal as it reflects a positive legacy of Rotherham's participation in the Women's Euro 2022 tournament. It will promote awareness of the club's inclusiveness amongst young women and schools and reflects the key goal of the service's Cultural Strategy to 'enable everyone to get active, get creative and get outdoors more often'.
- 2.4 Cllr David Sheppard, the Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Social inclusion and Neighbourhood Working has been consulted and is fully supportive of the proposal. The Leader and Ward Members have also been briefed.
- 2.5 Pending approval to enact the name change, the Club and Football Foundation have arranged for Millie Bright to attend site on 17th July 2024 for a photo opportunity linked to the renaming.

3. Options considered and recommended proposal

- 3.1 Not permitting the change would mean no change at the site. This could however jeopardise relations with the Club, who are the prime supporters of the name change. It may also risk the relationship with the Football Foundation and be seen as negative in future funding bids.
- 3.2 Recommendation is to proceed with the name change, as it is strongly supported and has tangible benefits as outlined in 2.3 above

4. Consultation on proposal

- 4.1 Killamarsh Dynamos have consulted widely with their members on the proposal. In line with stipulations in their lease regarding any change they wish to make, they have approached the Rother Valley Country Park Manager directly about the desired change and this has been escalated to Head of Service, Assistant Director and Cabinet Member, all of whom are in favour of the proposal.
- 4.2 In consultation with the Neighbourhoods team and Legal services, it is clear that the proposal fulfils the majority of terms of the Council's Land Naming Protocol. In this instance, the changes have been proposed directly to the Council rather than via ward members, who have been made aware of the proposal previously with no objection.

5. Timetable and Accountability for Implementing this Decision

5.1 The decision will be implemented on 16th July 2024, in time for the visit to site and official ceremony to celebrate the renaming on 17th July 2024.
