Proposed No Waiting at any Time restriction on Sunny Lane and Grace Rose Avenue, Waverley

1.	Background
1.1	As part of an approved planning application for a new retail development within the 'new' Waverley community development, it was required that both sides (whole length) of the proposed access road, named Sunny Lane, and a small length of an additional access road named Grace Rose Avenue, (both of which are currently under construction), be subject to a no waiting at any time restriction, over the lengths of road shown in Appendix A. The aim of the proposed waiting restriction is to ensure the free and safe flow of traffic along these sections of roads. See Appendix A.
2.	Key Issues
2.1	The approved planning application will develop the land to the west of Stephenson Way, between Stephenson Way and Highfield Spring. This area of land was previously undeveloped land. Vehicle access to this retail element of the development site, is via Grace Rose Avenue, which will have two-way traffic flow, before turning right onto Sunny Lane, and right again to head back toward Stephenson Way. At the point where the final right turn is made on Sunny Lane, the road itself narrows and will be subject to a one-way restriction. The development is mixed use, with off street parking provision located nearby.
2.2	The section of Sunny Lane adjacent to the retail units, is not wide enough to cater for two-way traffic and therefore, upon opening to the public, will be signed one-way toward Stephenson Way. In order to ensure that vehicles do not park on this narrow road, a no waiting at any time restriction is being promoted for both sides of the road. Where Sunny Lane is wide enough to accommodate two-way traffic, there is the potential that drivers would park in these areas, which would affect the free and safe flow of traffic. Therefore, the proposed no waiting at any time restriction has been promoted to include the whole length of Sunny Lane (both sides), and also the Sunny Lane junction with Grace Rose Avenue (north side), in order to ensure the free and safe flow of traffic. It should be noted that these roads are currently under construction and are not yet adopted highway, though it is the intention that they will become adopted highway following due process.
3.	Options considered and recommended proposal
3.1	One option considered, was having no lengths of waiting restrictions at all along the lengths of road under investigation. However, after further investigation, this option was not considered appropriate.
3.2	It is proposed to implement the no waiting at any time restriction shown on appendix A, Drawing No 100785
