2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

Route optimisation work has sought to identify the most efficient model of refuse collection both based on the current 5 day collection model as well as a potential 4 day collection model. To explore this a high-level report was provided by externally appointed consultants Bartec in the Autumn of 2024 which demonstrated that there were no significant savings to be gained through changing to a four-day model and as a result, in light of the additional risks this would present operationally and to the public, the service began to develop the detailed routing required to enact the 5 day

optimised model. The 5 day model did present the opportunity to deliver some savings and in March 2025 Council approved the Revenue Saving entitled Waste Service Route Optimisation. Further information is provided on the final financial forecasts below.
