2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening
<p>The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 introduced new requirements for local authorities in relation to domestic abuse services. As a result of the new requirements, the Government made funding available to Rotherham Council which has continued year on year.</p> <p>In January 2025, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government confirmed the 2025-26 domestic abuse duty funding of £802,591 which is an uplift from the previous year of £158,590.</p>

This report explains the continued allocation of funding to projects commissioned in 2024-25. It also sets out proposals for the allocation of the uplift funding for new projects in 2025-26, which will aim to bolster the current domestic abuse service offer.

The recommended proposals consider the Council’s statutory duty under the Domestic Abuse Act 2021 and the need to take longer term decisions in order to ensure best value for money and to provide the best chance of improving outcomes for victims of domestic abuse.

- Meet the requirements of the Domestic Abuse Act 2021, by ensuring children as

victims are receiving support in their own right.

This was refreshed and reported to MHCLG in 2025.</li> <li>- Project monitoring and performance management information for all projects is collated quarterly and reported to the Safer Rotherham Partnership Domestic Abuse Priority Group and Safer Rotherham Partnership Board as part of governance arrangements.</li> <li>- Monitoring data is collected by protected characteristic group where appropriate and analysed for equality of access and outcomes.</li> </ul>
