The current Brinsworth Parish Council area (polling districts BWB, BWC, BWD, BWE) does not currently incorporate all addresses that have Brinsworth in their address, as those houses north of Bawtry Road (polling district BWA) are not currently in the parish. It is to be noted that in the last Community Governance Review in 2008, a proposal was made to incorporate BWA into Brinsworth Parish Council, however this was overwhelmingly rejected by those residents in a poll of the area at the time. It is also noted that during the LGBCE review of Rotherham in the lead up to the 2021 council elections, that draft proposals for Brinsworth Ward were made by RMBC to only include the Brinsworth Parish Council boundary, however it was argued and accepted by LGBCE that incorporating polling district BWA into Brinsworth Ward kept the whole Brinsworth Community together and having the same representation was logical. Having spoken to residents of BWA polling district, they are rightly concerned about the cost of the precept by becoming part of Brinsworth Parish Council, as this is not something they currently pay at all, given they are currently not part of any parish council.

It is to be noted making Brinsworth Parish Council conterminous with the RMBC borough ward boundary (BWA, BWB, BWC, BWD, BWE) would align the parish council boundaries with the defined community of Brinsworth. This would remove an artificial historic boundary that there currently is, that in any practical sense both residents of BWA and current Brinsworth Parish Council area do not currently see.

It is noted that over the decades there have been several Brinsworth Parish Councillors elected who have lived in BWA.

As ward councillors, we would ask that if this proposal to expand Brinsworth Parish Council to include BWA is moved forward, that residents of BWA are intensely consulted and polled so that their views can be represented.

In addition, we feel that the number of parish councillors that there are currently on Brinsworth Parish Council (11) is the maximum number that this should be, even if BWA were to be incorporated into the parish council. It is noted that the NALC guidance is decades old and only a suggestion, not bounded in legislation. We feel that there is scope to reduce this number to 9 parish councillors, even if BWA were incorporated into the parish council.

This is due to the fact that contested elections for Brinsworth Parish Council over the last two electoral cycles have improved the quality, transparency, and governance of Brinsworth Parish Council, and that residents having the opportunity to vote in an election for parish councillors every 4 years is a good thing. We feel reducing the number to 9 parish councillors would enable efficient running of the council, and reduces the likelihood of the parish council having to operate with long-term unfilled casual vacancies.

The Community Governance Review asks for a comment on whether Brinsworth Parish Council should be warded or unwarded. We feel that this should remain unwarded. We feel that the current arrangement of all parish councillors representing the whole village gives them a mandate and voice for the whole of the village, rather than feeling an obligation to stand up for their ward. Additionally, we do not think that the current polling district boundaries make geographic or community sense for parish wards.
