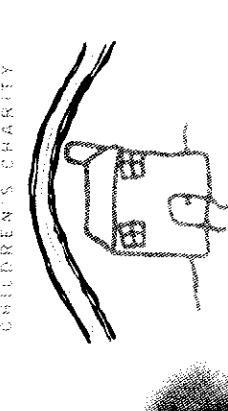
"My husband Nick and I, and our son, Alex were supported by Rainbow Trust Children's Charity during Elise's illness and have since received bereavement support as well.
