Description:

Implement a joint approach to an integrated rapid response service, including out of hours, capable of meeting holistic needs of identified individuals to reduce hospital admission. Incorporate community nursing, enabling and commissioned domiciliary care, to be funded the through the BCF to protect social care services from the impact of additional community based support packages.

Additional assessment time (social care support) to be provided through the BCF as part of the response, in order to enable throughput through the Fast Response service, either into funded packages or through the social care prescribing offer into community based prevention activity.

Outcome:

A coordinated response is provided to individuals' needs, which supports them to remain independent while reducing admissions to residential care and hospital.
