I live in the flats at Fitzwilliam Court, between Fitzwilliam Street, and Old Cross Lane and I can see from your letter the proposal to paint double yellow lines along the corners of these two roads to try to stop traffic congestion. In my opinion this is just moving the problem away from the areas of the schools and causing distress to other households further up the streets. Apart from the cost of putting down these lines, it would also require someone to monitor these double yellow lines.
