

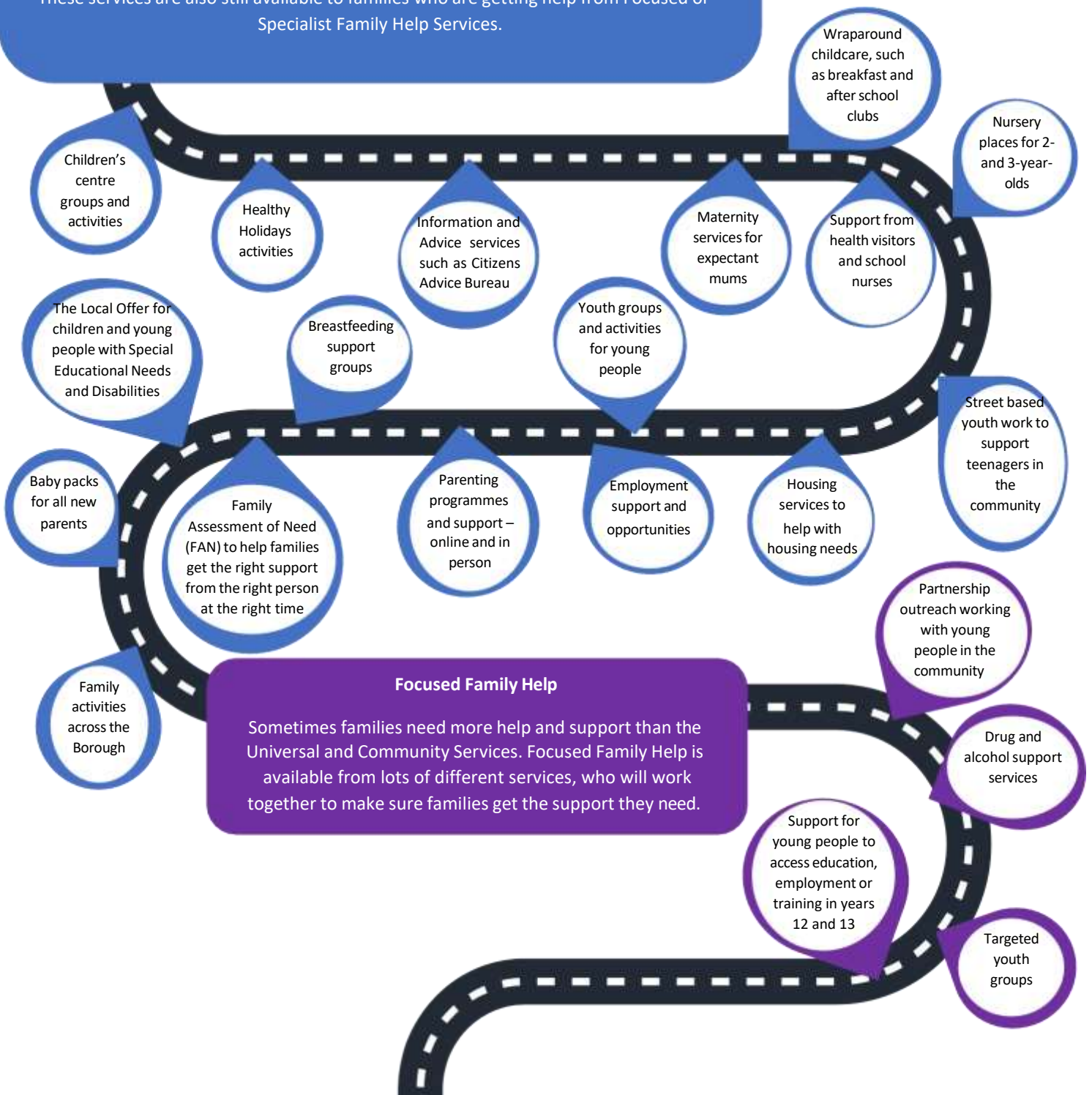
FAMILY HELP ROAD MAP

We want to make sure that children, young people, and families know how to get help, and it is available to them when they need it. We know that helping early can make the biggest difference for children and their families. We might know that families need help because they tell us or someone else might tell us on their behalf, such as a family member or professional who is working with them. This document is to help families understand the different support and help available.

Universal and Community Family Help

Universal and community services are for everyone – all children, young people, and families in Rotherham. These services help families to get the right support at the right time. These services are provided by lots of different agencies such as nurseries, schools and colleges; GPs, midwives, and 0-19 public health nursing; Family Hubs; libraries; youth services; and community organisations. These are the place to start for any family in Rotherham wanting information, advice and support.

These services are also still available to families who are getting help from Focused or Specialist Family Help Services.

Specialist Family Help is provided to children and their families where there is a need for a high level of support or they may be experiencing or likely to suffer significant harm.

Specialist health services

Family Group Conferencing of family networking to support children to remain within their family network where it is safe to do so

Education and health support for children in care

Specialist services for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities including Specialised Short Breaks

Partnership working to investigate concerns and keep children safe

Youth Justice Services for young people
