It is concluded that the proposal has no significant impact on the climate. Adaptation recognises how the climate will change and there will be impacts to specific cohorts of people, for example, the elderly are at particular risk of being impacted on by extreme weathers, such as heatwaves. However, actions recommended in the report do not affect the Council's ability to continue during or recover after extreme weather-related events, nor do they affect residents' capacity to adapt to the impact of climate change.

Reducing carbon emissions and working towards net zero targets, is part of the One Council theme in the Council Plan 2025-30. Actions under this theme include but are not limited to cutting down on activities that waste energy and resources; using the Councils influence to encourage partners, local businesses, anchor organisations, and our residents to be mindful of their environmental impact and to be more sustainable.

Provide a summary of all impacts and mitigation/monitoring measures:

Cabinet has previously noted the permanent closure of the Resource Centre. The building is deemed unsafe and therefore the recommendation is the best course of action. Although it is difficult to quantify with any reliability emissions from demolition, this will be a one-time impact. If the building was retained, it would require remedial works to a higher minimum standard and there would be emissions to consider from ongoing use of the building. Whilst any construction related to the future use of the land will have some degree of impact on the climate, the social need to use the land outweighs this. It is therefore concluded that the recommendation will have no significant impact on the climate.
